Germany Receives Wilson's Note In Friendly Manner

(Continued from Page One.)

many's answer would be, Bryan refused to say. The secretary declined to discuss the report of Ambassador Gerard in any way.

There is not the slightest doubt that Germany will ask the United States to prevent passengers from going across merchantmen carrying munitions. The administration can accomplish this by refusing clearance papers to vessels carrying passengers with munitions aboard. Under the neutrality law passed by congress the government has arbitrary powers and could take such action.

Secretary Bryan today said he had received no intimation as to when Germany's reply might be expected or what it would contain. He was greatly interested in reports that the reply would be expected.

If Germany should demand that the United States make representations to the League regarding the attempt of the British to starve Germany the administration could reopen the matter of the United States embargo on the transportation of munitions to Germany. The United States refused to accept the British ultimatum inasmuch as the "blockade" of Germany as final, and diplomats say the question could be easily reopened.

Although refusing to discuss the ambassador's report, Secretary Bryan says it is to be more hopeful today than at any time since the Lusitania was sunk. With the announcement of the receipt of Gerard's report, the secretary then announced the signing of his arbitration treaties with Great Britain, Norway, Peru and Bolivia.

A copy of Ambassador Gerard's report was forwarded to President Wilson in New York. It is not intended that it should be public, as the contents are confidential and the issues are too delicate to permit of comment which might result in complications.

One of the most significant developments since the note was made public is the deluge of telegrams and letters to the White House pledging support to the policies of President Wilson as outlined in the communication to Germany. Many are from prominent German-Americans.

The accumulation of these letters and telegrams over Sunday was more than three feet high. A typical letter from the Lusitanian German-American Catholic Union of 8000 members. The spirit of President Wilson's note was endorsed and pledged the union to "allegiance to one flag," but concluded by stating that a peaceful solution of the problem before the two countries might be reached.

Although officialdom is generally hopeful for peace, it is understood today that both the army and navy departments are not overlooking another possibility. Admiral Houston, the new chief of staff, has gone to New York. He will be back Tuesday. It is said, it is understood that Houston will confer with Admiral Fletcher regarding the fleet maneuvers which began tomorrow.

When steaming outside the Ambrose channel lightship, the fleet will begin a series of maneuvers intended to demonstrate whether New York could be safe in event of an attack by a hostile fleet.

The military departments have already reported regarding the exact condition of munitions of the army and navy. This report admittedly was not made, but the munition factories are now running at top speed and if the government needed them they could be manufactured.

upon the American tank steamer Gulf-Flight. It can be stated on the best authority that so far as the Gulf-Flight is concerned, the Kaiser's reply will leave nothing to be desired by the American government. Every possible reparation will be offered in the hope of eliminating this phase of the controversy.

Neither Americans in Germany nor the German press expect that the reply from the foreign office will be of such nature as to precipitate a crisis. In the absence of official and unofficial statements or discussion, the most interesting part is the obvious air of optimism that prevails, based upon the belief that America has not yet, but ultimately will, get Germany's viewpoint and will give it consideration.

The apparent lack of resentment and the acceptance by the foreign office of America's protestations of friendship is reflected in the press today commenting upon the unofficial outlines of the note, coupled with the expression of regret that the United States does not recognize that Germany's submarine warfare is in self-defense against England's plan of starving Germany non-combatants.

That Germany may be expected to abandon her submarine activities is not taken seriously here. Instead, Germany will endeavor, I am informed, to show that the American suggestion amounts to asking Germany to lay aside her most effective weapon—one which may decide the ultimate issue—rather than put Americans to the inconvenience of using only American ships. So far as Americans are concerned the situation is calm here. As it has been unanimously revealed about the foreign office, the opinion is that the United States, without intending to be unfriendly to Germany, has been blind to the latitude allowed by laws of self-defense.

GERMAN PLEDGES LOYALTY.

Former Soldier Says Those in America Will Sustain President.

St. Louis, Mo., May 17.—Baldolph Beerend, member of the city council, president of the National Organization of Former Members of the German Army, declared today that in case of war between the United States and Germany, German-Americans would be found standing solidly behind the president and fighting against the Fatherland.

"There can be no question as to the attitude of the German-Americans," said Mr. Beerend. "The Germans would organize in their own ranks regiments to defend this country, should the United States be fighting for this country just as was the case when Germany organized their own troops during the Civil War."

"The Germans of this country give President Wilson credit for meeting a trying situation fairly, for doing his utmost to preserve neutrality, and, right or wrong, in case of war, would be with him to a man."
