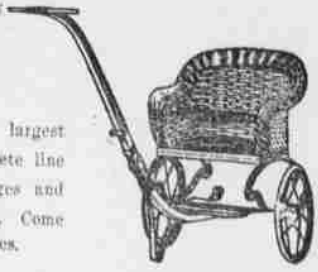

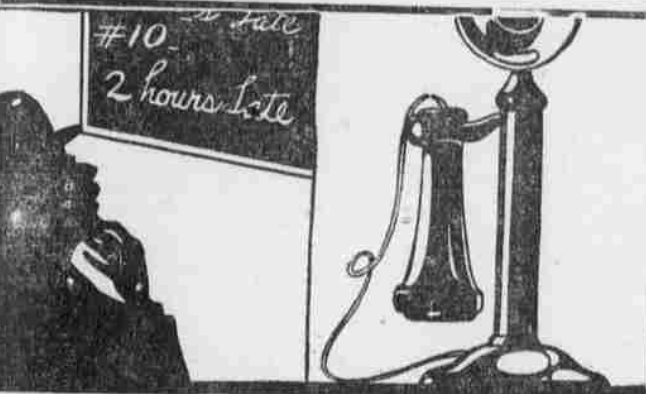

Judge Who Silenced I. W. W. Orators Dies Seattle, Wash., May 29.—Judge John E. Humphries, member of the King county superior bench since 1912, died at his home here today of uremic poisoning. He was taken ill last Saturday and left the courthouse assisted by friends. Judge Humphries came to Seattle in 1889 and practiced law for a number of years. In 1908 he was a candidate for the supreme bench, but was defeated. In 1910 he was defeated as a candidate for United States senator. In the position he was filling at the time of his death, Judge Humphries handed down many important decisions, among which was the sentencing to jail for street speaking of nearly 300 I. W. W.'s following the Pochter riots in 1913. Judge Humphries was 63 years old. The workman's compensation law doesn't entitle a man to damages for the accident of birth.
