Demands That Warring Factions Select Strong Provisional Government

CARRANZA REPORTS THAT HE HAS BOUGHT CORN

Washington, June 1--President Wilson's note calling upon the warring factions of Mexico to reconcile their differences and select a strong provisional government will be made public tomorrow.
