Two Women Guilty of Murdering Babe

Portland, Ore., July 8.—Pleas of guilty to charges of manslaughter were entered in the circuit court here today by Mrs. Bessie Powle, aged 53 and her 17 year old daughter, Harriett, indicted in connection with the death of the infant son of the latter.

Mrs. Powle confessed that she had smothered the child to death by placing a cloth saturated with kerosene over its face, and the daughter acknowledged that the baby had been killed at her suggestion and urging.

The baby was born May 16 and put to death the following day. The body was buried under a raspberry bush in a lot adjoining the Powle home where it was found by police officers.
