GERMANS HAMMER AT DEFENSES OF WARSAW

Russian Forces Driven Back Upon New Lines of Defense Forty Miles From Warsaw—Fifty Thousand Prisoners Taken—Russians Admit Steady Retirement But Deny Reports of Heavy Losses

Berlin, via London, July 20.—Russian forces to the north of Warsaw have been forced back upon new positions less than forty miles from the Polish capital. In the first official statement issued from the war office since Sunday...

the Lublin-Cholm railway toward which Field Marshal Von Mackensen is battering his way in the movement upon Warsaw from southern Poland. In the Riga region the evacuation of Tukum is reported. The enemy is now advancing toward Hofzumberg.

Russians Admit Retreat. Petrograd, July 20.—Admission of a steady retirement before the Germans at a half dozen points was made by the war office in its statement today.

Paris, July 20.—Six French aeroplanes showed the railway station at Colmar with bombs, the war office announced today. Four airmen also attacked the railway junction at Challemagne, hurling numerous bombs upon the positions.

DEATH WATCH OVER FIVE MURDERERS. Arizona's Deferred Hanging Bee Scheduled To Take Place On July 30

Phoenix, Ari., July 20.—The death watch was again placed today over the five murderers condemned to hang in Florence penitentiary before July 30. These are the five men who were saved from the gallows at an eleventh hour last May by the intervention of W. J. Bryan, then secretary of state.

GOLD FROM ALASKA. Seattle, Wash., July 20.—In 1867 the United States paid \$7,200,000 for the territory of Alaska. In 1915, six vessels arriving in one day from Alaska brought to the port of Seattle cargoes valued at \$720,000.

WELSH COAL STRIKE IS SETTLED TODAY BY LLOYD-GEORGE. Chancellor of Empire Succeeds In Making Terms With Dissatisfied Miners

Cardiff, Wales, July 20.—The most serious industrial crisis in England since the opening of the war passed today when the strike of more than 125,000 miners in the coal fields of South Wales was settled. The mine owners agreed to grant a minimum wage increase of ten per cent to the men.

STUPENDOUS CAMPAIGN LAUNCHED BY GERMANS. Not Since Days of Alexander Great Has World Seen Anything Approaching It—Daring Effort To Crush Russia and Release Great Armes For Western Operations

London, July 20.—The most stupendous campaign since the time of Alexander the Great is now not only threatening Warsaw but contemplates the envelopment of the chief Russian field armies. Communications from the war office in Berlin and Petrograd today revealed the vast extent of the German operations on the eastern front in such a way as fairly to stagger military critics.

DOG ORDINANCE IS HELD TO BE VOID BY SUPREME COURT. City Has Power To Pass Ordinance But Must Notify Owners of Dogs

DECISION IS VIRTUAL VICTORY FOR CITY. Ordinance Held To Be Void On One Point Only and Can Be Remedied

Judge Galloway's decision relative to dogs running at large in the city of Salem was affirmed in the supreme court this morning in a decision written by Justice Benson. The dogs may not romp and gambol with entire freedom through the city streets under the protection of a license tag, however, an absolute right to pass the ordinance making it necessary that all dogs feel the restraining influence of a leading chain while taking the air, but affirmed the decision of the lower court upon the point that it is necessary to give due notice before a dog may be killed, which was not provided for in the proposed ordinance.

GREAT STRIKE ON AT BRIDGEPORT AND SPREADS RAPIDLY. Threats of Union Leaders Carried Out When Employes Lay Down Tools

Bridgeport, Conn., July 20.—Threats of the strike at the Remington Arms and Ammunition plant assuming more serious proportions became a reality today when 600 machinists and bricklayers walked out at noon today. "FRIENDLY BUT FINAL" DESCRIBES REPLY NOTE

Cabinet Considers Rejoinder to Germany's Reply, Although Several Members Are Absent—Matter Up To President and Secretary—Orduna Incident Will Be Probed and Affidavits of Passengers Taken

Washington, July 20.—The tentative draft of the new note to Germany dealing with the submarine warfare was laid before the cabinet today. Despite the importance of the matter to be discussed several members of the cabinet were absent, but it is realized that President Wilson and Secretary of State Lansing are largely handling the situation alone. "Friendly but final," was the way a high administration official characterized the new communication today. It will be revised and perfected after today's cabinet meeting and will be approved at the session of ministers on Friday. If nothing arises to interrupt this program it is thought likely that the new protest will go forward to Berlin at the end of the week.
