

WILLAMETTE PACIFIC RAILROAD TO COOS BAY COMPLETE IN SPRING

According to the Bulletin, the fourth era Pacific publication, the last spike in the Willamette Pacific railroad connecting Eugene and Marshfield, will be driven in the vicinity of Starbuck, or about where the line crosses the Umpqua river. Delay in completion of

this bridge will prevent the opening of the road through to Coos Bay by the first of 1916, but with the ferrying of trains across the river it will be possible to commence heading freight and passengers over the entire line by the end of this year. The extension of driving the last spike will probably be in the mountain next spring.

The bridge across the bay between North Bend and Marshfield is nearing completion and the main river bridge is no longer a barrier in progress. The bridge across the Umpqua is going as rapidly as possible.

Estimated cost of bridge, according to the railway company's bulletin. The bridge over the Umpqua river has a 2,000-foot through span and two 200-foot cantilever spans. The total weight of the approach and main span is 1,800,000 pounds.
