ITALY WILL SEND AID TO ALLIES IN TURKEY

New York, Aug. 10.—Italy will send 500,000 fresh troops to either France or the Dardanelles within the next three weeks, according to Captain Victor Del Franchetti, of the Italian army, who arrived today.

"There were 500,000 troops in Turkey when I left," said Captain Del Franchetti, "and 120,000 more in Taranto, the naval base. Between 150 and 200 large transports were ready to convey the troops to where they are most needed."

The captain will purchase leather goods for the Italian army and expects to visit numerous New England factories.
