### SHE TOOK POISON

San Francisco, Sept. 16.—Just as the bright lights in the safe district were waning, pretty Rosanna Burke, 20 years old, sat on a curb at Eddy and Mason streets today and took bichloride of mercury. She had passed the night in that section. Taken to a hospital, she claimed not to know where she had obtained the poison and only sighed when asked why she had taken it.

### Republican Party Has No "Standpatters"

Portland, Or., Sept. 15.—There is not a "stand patter" in the Republican party. James B. Reynolds, secretary of the Republican national committee says so.

"We have not got anything to stand pat on," he explained here today. "You see," he continued, "the democrats have everything their own way just now, and we are certainly not standing pat on anything they have done."

"Anyway everybody is progressive. It is only a question of a speed limit. Some people are a little faster in their progressiveness than others," Reynolds resides in Washington, D. C., and he is out on a little scouting trip to see to what extent the Republican party is convalescing from its late attack of pains in the stomach which resulted from the party biting off more than it could chew at a notable gathering in Chicago.

"The party is looking fine," he said. "The progressives are coming back. The progressives, from Roosevelt down, are opposed to the democrats the same as the republicans are and the only way to get the democrats out of office is to elect a republican president." Reynolds will visit eighteen states on this trip. He is conferring today with Chairman C. B. Moores of the state republican committee and other prominent republicans. He will leave this afternoon for San Francisco.

### Governor of California Reprives Three Men

Sacramento, Cal., Sept. 16.—Reprives were granted today by the governor to Charles Oxniam, Glen Witt and Fernando Mammalito, who were to have been hanged September 24. Oxniam and Witt were relieved until November 19 and Mammalito until October 19. Oxniam and Witt were convicted of the murder of William Alexander at Los Angeles. Oxniam is at San Quentin and Witt at Folsom. Mammalito killed a storekeeper in Alameda county. He is at San Quentin.

In connection with the reprives Governor Johnson announced that he had turned over the cases of the three men and also those of Louis Bundy and Earl Loomis to the new state advisory board of pardon for recommendation. This board, composed of Lieutenant Governor Eshleman, Attorney General Webb and Wardens Johnson and Smith, has the right to recommend action, but the power to commute sentences remains with the governor.
