Annexation of Mexico Declared Only Solution

San Francisco, Sept. 18.—Denouncing President Wilson's Mexican policy with a virulence that startled his listeners, Dudley Norris, prominent mining engineer today told the American institute of mining engineers convention that William H. Taft was mainly responsible for the present Mexican problem.

"Taft should have shot 400 United States regulars at the first bunch of Mexicans that showed fight. That would have put a stop to all this misery and sorrow and destruction of property."

"I got all my money out of there two years before the storm broke. I saw the signs of the times."

"The Mexican army was weak. It was a bluff. Recruited from the prisons it lacked loyalty. It wouldn't stand the gaff in the pinch, so I drew out."

"There is nothing ahead for Mexico but annexation. It is bound to come sooner or later."
