## Atlantic Transport Liner Sets Sail For War Zone

San Francisco, Sept. 23.-With much protection from hostile sub marines as a liberal supply of red white and blue pains in the form of huge American flags can afford, the Atlantic Transport liner Koren today set sail yesterday arternoon for the European war zone. The Koren wil attempt to evade German sumarine with its cargo of California product destined for England.

Captain A. W. Nelson, who has sailed the Pacific for three decades and com manded the Korea ever since it was launched by its form., swaers, the Pacific Mail Steamship company, said he has every chance of getting in and out of England without being torpedoed.
"Submarines cannot mistake us," he

said, glancing at the side of his vessel where the inscription "American S. S. Korea'' was painted between two huge American flags.

The Koren was to have sailed this morning but its departure was delayed. Strict precautions were taken by the ship's officers at the wharf. Only perons with eredentials or related to the members of the erew were allowed aboard. Every article taken aboard was No. No carefully examined for explosives.
