This Month Holds Record For "Dry" Town Drunks

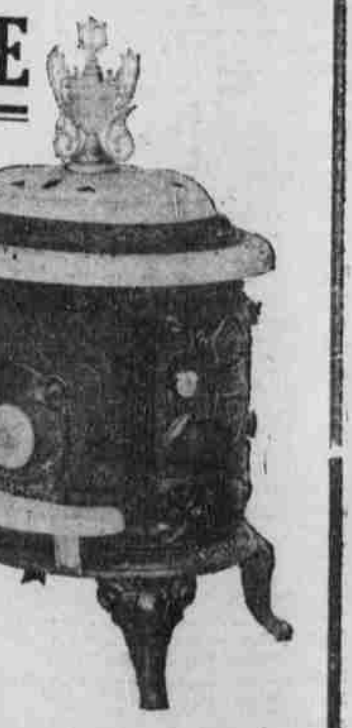
So far this month has established the record for drunks since the town wet dry has been established and 21 have been arrested and fined to date.

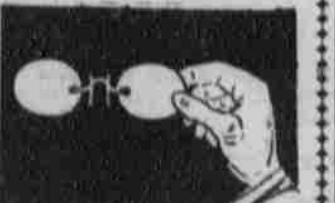
Work on the bridge at Center and Fourteenth streets is being pushed and the prospects are that it will be opened for traffic in about three weeks.
