WILL PLEAD GUILTY
DECLARES JAS. M'GILL

L. W. W. Murderer Decides to Make No Fight in Courts For Liberty

Stockton, Cal., Sept. 28.—"I'm going to plead guilty and I'm ready to take my medicine. I want to get it over with as quickly as possible. Whatever the judge gives me will mean life to me," said James McGill confessed L. W. W. arsonist, when brought before Justice Parker this morning.

McGill was speedily hauled before the superior court on a charge of firing the bars and slaughter house of Joe Dietz at Leek August 25 last. His case will probably be rushed through the courts today. Tomorrow, in all probability he will be in the Folsom or San Quentin.

That McGill is a weakling and was only a cutspaw in the hands of the higher ups of the L. W. W. organization, is the belief of Sheriff William Roelke. The officers are now bending all their energies toward the capture of Charles Anderson and Tony Williams, from whom McGill states that he received all of his instructions and by whom he alleges he was paid. The sheriff has obtained good descriptions of the men but states that they probably have escaped from California.

McGill is completely broken in health and spirit and his condition is pitiable. He states that he was arrested in Sacramento because he was found in a house near which a crime was committed. He was sentenced to six months for vagrancy and was released from custody after serving his term. McGill came out of jail embittered against society and the world in general.

"I met Anderson and Williams in the jungles near Sacramento," says McGill, "and they made a proposition to me to join in setting these fires in order to create a sentiment that would force the governor to pardon Ford and Suhr. At the time I thought it was the right thing to do.

"Anderson and Williams agreed to pay me \$5 a week and supply me with food. I got all my money from them and they said that they got it from headquarters. The L. W. W. has headquarters in Sacramento and in Portland, Oregon.

"I don't expect or ask any reward for telling my story. I only hope that I may be able to make some amends for what I have done. My home is in Portland, Maine, McGill isn't my true name. My aged father is still living and I don't want to bring shame on his head so I won't tell my right name.

"My parents were religious and I was brought up as a Christian. I came out to this coast about four years ago. I was out of work and fell in with these L. W. W.s. I guess the decency in me is just beginning to come out."
