Claim Made That All Slav Attacks Against Russians Were Repulsed

FOREMOST RANKS OF RUSSIANS MOWED DOWN

Heavy Artillery Fire Checked Rusians and Sent Them Reeling Back

Vienna, Oct. 15-(By wireless to Sayville.)—Austrian forces have thrown serious obstacles in the path of the Russian steam roller. It was officially claimed today that all Slav attacks against the Austrians had been repulsed, while small engagements along the Montenegro and Harzegovinian

frontier were reported.

The main Russian attack was west of Tarnopol, where the Slavs stormed in three files. Only the foremost ranks were protected and the Austrians mowed them down and dreve them back with heavy loss.

Favorable progress in the Serbian operations was likewise claimed.

Concerning Wednesday's operations, the statement said: "Our troops stormed the region of Belgrade, advancing to the southeast to the fortress-like positions on the Erino, Brdo, Cunak, Stawaras line. The enemy who, according to statements made by prisoners had been ordered to stand to the last man, fled to the Avala mountains and the fied to the Avala mountains and the region to the east. It's losses were ex-traordinarily heavy."

CZAR FERDINAND HOT FOR NATIONAL HONOR

Calls On His People To Defend and Deliver Their **Brothers From Serbians**

Sofin, via Berlin, and London, Oct. 15.—Calling upon his people and army to "defend the national soil violated by a perfidious neighbor (Serbin) and to deliver our brothers from the Serbian yoke," Czar Ferdinand today issued a manifesto in which he explained and defended his course in aligning Bulgaria with the central allies.

BOMBARDMENT HOWEVER IS FIERCER THAN EVER

If Siege Is Abandoned the Troops Withdrawn Will Be Sent to Aid Serbia

London, Oct. 15,—Despite the suggestion in the house of lords yesterday that the siege of the Dardanelles may be abandoned, the allies were reported in news dispatches today to be bombarding the defenses more fiercely toan ever. Whether this is merely a final effort to crimble these seemingly impregnable protections, the public has no means of knowing.

Unquestionably Lord Milner's inslatence on a transfer of operations from the Gallipoli peninsula elsewhere has caused great discouragement in Eagland. Replying to Lord Milner's idea, Lord Lansdowne of the cabinet, refused to promise either that the Milner suggestion would not be adopted. In this connection however, he pointed out toat it would be unpariotic to force the government further to disclose its hand regarding present operations, though he suggested the situation at present is grave, and that there are several factors confronting the allies, including the failure of Greece to define her attiture with certainty.
