No Evidence Shipments To Neutral Nations Were Intended for Germany

San Francisco, Nov. 2.--"San Francisco knows how" the seventy-eight turnstiles at the Panama-Pacific exposition seemed to assert, as San Francisco, aided by adjoining bay cities and towns, trooped through the exposition gates today to celebrate its "day" at the fair.

Special schedules are in effect on all ferries heading into San Francisco from cities across the bay, and in the city every car was pressed into service.

Passenger traffic men estimated that fully 100,000 visitors had arrived in San Francisco from all parts of the state, as well as many hundreds from the east.

Leaders awoke early today caused some apprehension as to the weather.

The heavy traffic on the ferries indicated that Alameda county's promise that 100,000 of her citizens would help San Francisco celebrate would be fulfilled.

At 12 o'clock the official attendance figures were 138,100.
