

This you may think is a high figure, but we are un-11d der state supervision and subject to state inspection, and the state insists on the most modern appliances, experienced nurses, and everything that tends to the latest system in the care of babies. As a result, these little ones although coming to us poorly nourished and sometimes of poor parentage, soon grow into life and activity and are adopted. In the twenty-six years of our existence as a baby home we have cared for more than 1400 of these little ones.
