Madison, Wis., Dec. 2.—Officials suspected today that destruction of the French Battery and Carbon company's plant here last night by fire with \$100,000 loss might be part of a nationwide anti-ally activity inasmuch as the company had been engaged on contracts for the allies.  
Several mysterious explosions were heard before the fire.  
On Guard at Tacoma.  
Tacoma, Wash., Dec. 2.—The receipt of more anonymous letters threatening the destruction of Japanese liners loading war munitions here for Vladivostok, the wiring of the under part of the Milwaukee wharves for electric lights and the installation of chemical fire fighting apparatus in the warehouses, were features of today's developments in the alleged plot to destroy the Milwaukee railroad docks and steamships berthed there.  
One of the letters received by the railroad officials, it is said, also threatened the destruction of a part of Seattle's water front and the city's fire tugs.

## Suggests New Plan For Ship Purchase

Washington, Dec. 2.—Chairman Alexander of the house merchant marine committee has before him today the framework of the administration's plan for removal of the ship purchase bill fight.  
Briefly, what the government now wants, as outlined by Secretaries Redfield and McAdoo are:  
A government board similar to the interstate commerce commission to look after deep water traffic.  
Appropriation of \$50,000,000 for building ships to create an American merchant marine, which could be used, in emergency, as naval auxiliaries.  
No government stockholdings corporation, as provided in the former bill, unless popular subscription failed to meet financial requirements.
