CONQUEST OF SERBIA. Berlin, by wireless to Sayville, L. I., Dec. 12.—The Teutonic conquest of Serbia is completed, for the Anglo-French forces have been completely driven out of the country.

GREECE YIELDS A POINT. Salonika, Dec. 12.—A satisfactory agreement has been reached between the allies and Greek authorities for free movement of the allies between Salonika and the frontier, the zone in which the allies must retreat.

Italians Make Gains. Rome, Dec. 13.—In the difficult lofty zone between the Giudicaria and Cuneo valleys, said the war office today, "a succession of brilliant offensives have won us the possession of strong heights which assure us of complete possession of the Bemizogge basin."

Trying "Economic Pressure." London, Dec. 13.—Great Britain intends to inflict all possible economic pressure on Germany in an effort to win the war. Under Foreign Secretary Cecil Woodhouse today, he said that the commercial agreement assuring that articles Denmark imports from England will not go to Germany involved no change of policy.

Russians Capture Post. Berlin, by wireless to Sayville, L. I., Dec. 12.—The Russians have captured a post near Riga, but the gain is not important, the war office claimed today.

Sunk by Submarine. London, Dec. 13.—The 2547-ton British vessel Pinogrove has been sunk by a submarine and 22 of her crew were saved.

Will Avoid Conscription. London, Dec. 13.—England, it is believed today, will avoid conscription. Lord Derby's recruiting campaign is reported to have brought 3,000,000 men to the call of "your king and country."

Have Sunk 508 Vessels. Berlin, by wireless to Sayville, L. I., Dec. 13.—Austro-German submarines have sunk 508 vessels of a total tonnage of 917,919 since the war started, it was announced today.

Abe Martin. This is the key note of Secretary of the Navy Daniels' appeal for more ships to defend America as outlined in a naval report published today. In this report to congress, he asks \$217,652,174 for a starter. His five year total is \$502,482,214 or about \$3,000,000 more than the general board recommended—the first time a secretary has ever asked more than the board counseled.
