ESTABROOK, DARK HORSE, NOW LOOMS UP IN G. O. P. RACE



AT HOME
BEHIND HIS DESK

The spotlight of politics has shifted to a new figure. The man whom it now rests is Henry D. Estabrook, of New York and Nebraska. The story of American possibilities, political observers are saying, is told in Estabrook. A year ago he was an "unknown." Today he is a candidate for the Republican presidential nomination, a "dark horse," rapidly gaining speed.

Advice received in Washington are to the effect that sentiment is growing for Estabrook. Already Estabrook headquarters have been established in Omaha, and his friends are confident that he will land the Nebraska delegation.

Tall, square-shouldered and square-jawed, this new political figure is a man about sixty years of age. He achieved prominence in the practice of law in Omaha, was later well known in Chicago legal circles and now is a leader of the New York bar.

WELLAND CANAL WAS SLATED FOR BOMBS

Disgruntled Employee Gives Away Plot—Four Arrests Made, More to Follow

New York, Dec. 18.—With three men in the toils as alleged plotters to blast the Welland ship canal, the government today took into custody Frederick Schleit, a German clerk in the National City bank, the largest in the country, on a charge of participating in anti-allied conspiracies.

Plot Hatched in Buffalo. New York, Dec. 18.—In their campaign to rid the nation of anti-allied bomb plotters, federal agents today have ready for preliminary hearing Paul Koenig, Richard E. Leyendecker, and Fred Metzler, alias Reimer, believed to be Koenig's stenographer.

Leyendecker has been engaged ostensibly in selling antiques. In the possession of the arrested men, it is charged, were maps of a canal. The alleged plot was hatched in Buffalo, the government charges, with the intent of "destroying, mutilating and damaging" the canal.

Moreover, it is hinted that Koenig was engaged in other alleged violations of neutrality. Some facts of the alleged canal plot were withheld, as the government did not desire to "tip off its hand" completely at this time.
