AURORA HOP NOTES

Aurora dealers who have checked up every bale of hops in the Aurora section state that the exact number of bales in growers' hands outside the association is 9,064.

Aurora dealers say they are revising their figures upward in determining the 1915 crop. The following are the figures given in making up their latest estimate:

Shipped out 60,000 bales
In dealers' hands 8,000 bales
Association hops 26,000 bales
In growers' hands 20,000 bales

Which set of figures are correct will be shown within a few weeks. The quantity in growers' hands in the Aurora district indicates, however, that 8,000 bales is far too low for the whole state.

Many Examinations For Civil Service Positions

Those who have an ambition to serve the government in the railway railway or mail service will have to bide a wee, as the postoffice department has issued a circular stating that no examinations will be held for this service until after July 1, 1916.
