Woolgrowers Will Fight Against Homestead Law

Salt Lake City, Utah, Jan. 17.—A bit-ter fight is to be waged against the 640-agre homestead bill, now under de-640-acre homestrad bill, now under de-bate in congress, by the National Wool-growers' association. A lobby will be maintained at Washington, \$6,000 having been mised for this purpose at the convention which just closed here. Wool growers declared the pending bill make it possible for persons to file on 640 acres of grazing land and charge livestock growers exorbitant prices for it.
