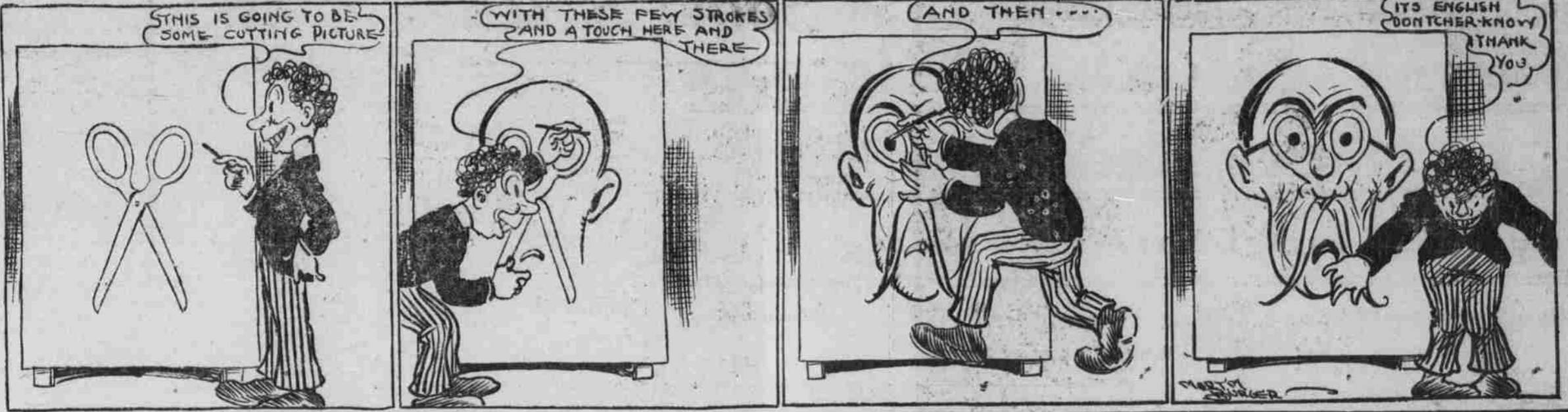


"HEEZA BOOB," as an Artist

Washington, Jan. 20.—A summary of estimates of numbers and values of live stock on farms and ranges on January 1, for Oregon and for the United States compiled by the Bureau of Crop Estimates and transmitted through the Weather Bureau, U. S. department of agriculture, is as follows:

State.—Number, 295,000, compared with 304,000 a year ago and 283,000 five years ago. Value per head, \$95, compared with \$90 a year ago and \$111 five years ago.

United States.—Number, 21,200,000 compared with 21,195,000 a year ago and 20,277,000 five years ago. Value per head, \$101.00, compared with \$103.33 a year ago and \$111.4 five years ago.

State.—Number, 10,000, compared with 10,000 a year ago and 10,000 five years ago. Value per head, \$95, compared with \$96 a year ago and \$119 five years ago.

United States.—Number, 4,500,000 compared with 4,490,000 a year ago and 4,325,000 five years ago. Value per head, \$113.87, compared with \$112.30 a year ago and \$125.92 five years ago.
