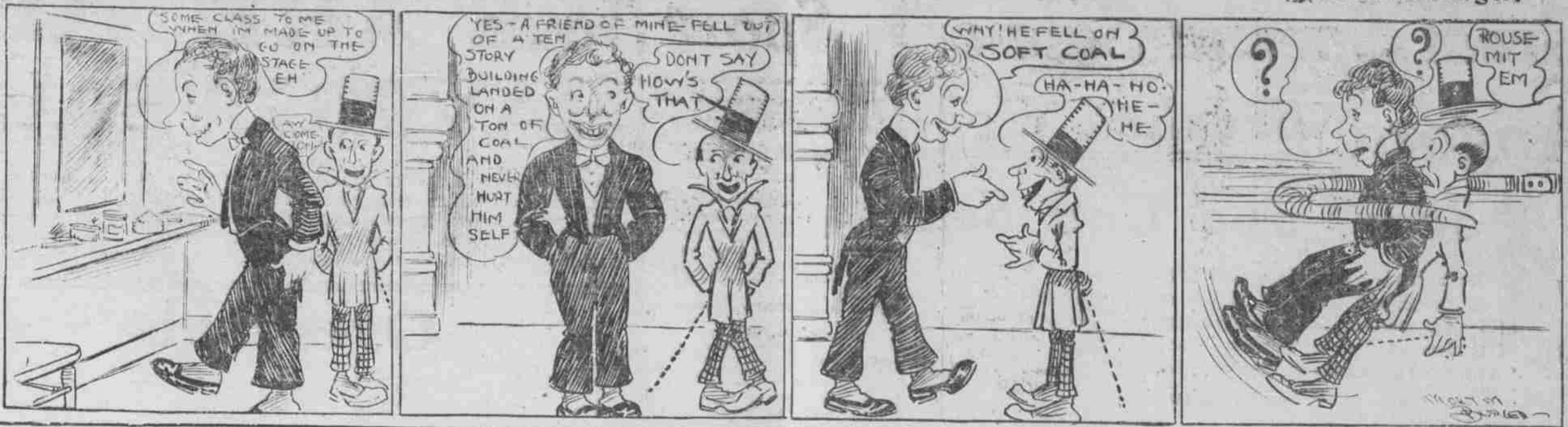

THE MARKETS

Wheat is weakening in Portland, and the best mills are offering today is 88 cents a bushel.

Although eggs are scarce on account of the unusual weather, the price holds about even, at 35 cents cash and 35 cents in trade.

Naturally, the farmer is interested in market quotations that inform him what he can expect from his produce if brought to the city. Quotations in grains and mill feed stuffs, butter and lard, fat, eggs and poultry and the live stock market, show the prices of the day and what is being paid to farmers. In the vegetable and fruit quotations, the prices are what the commission wholesale houses are selling for, not their buying price, or the price that would be paid to a farmer if he brought in produce. This price is hard to get, as each grocer pays according to his estimate of the value of the produce offered.

Commission houses claim that \$1.75 is the correct wholesale price for potatoes, while today a farmer could not get more than \$1.25 a bushel, either from a commission house or a grocer. But in general, the prices quoted on vegetables and fruits are for the business houses. Where there is two prices, one is what the grocers or commission houses are paying the farmers.
