Accident Commission Declares Exemption for Month of February

The state industrial accident commission has declared an exemption of payments for the month of February of all employers and the workmen of all employers who have paid their contributions for the past six successive months.

In addition to the above, the commission had on hand January 31, 1916, \$209,617.93, and due from the state for the seven months preceding \$42,829.39.

The exemption declared by the commission means that the state will carry the insurance risks of all operations in the state which are working under the act, and have qualified for the exemption, without cost for either employer or workman.
