SWEDEN IS ANGRY
Washington, Feb. 18.—Sweden yesterday requested the United States to start a joint neutral protest against alleged British violations of international law. The wording of the request, dealing largely with British concealment of mails, showed that Sweden is extremely irritated. No action has been taken because the administration does not desire to engage in a British controversy while the German-American situation is unsettled. Moreover, probably no action will be taken till the latter is terminated or until Colonel House returns from Europe and reports to President Wilson on his investigation there.
