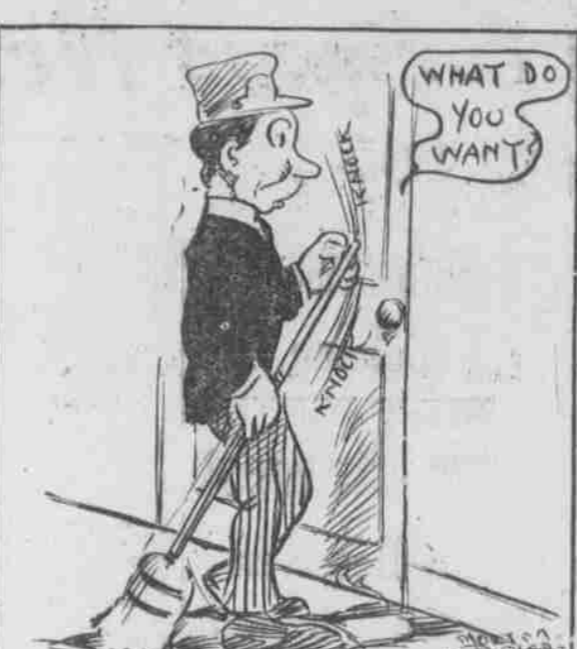

University of Oregon, Eugene, Ore., Mar. 10.—A workman in Emattila crew was joining a small piece of oak moulding. It caught and was thrown by the machine, causing his hand to drop into the knives.
