NO MORE MIXING OF CEMENT ON STREETS
Ordinance To Be Submitted to Stop It, and Another About Car Fenders

An ordinance will be presented to the city council at the meeting this evening making it unlawful to mix mortar, plaster, Portland cement, concrete, asphaltic concrete or any substance which will set and harden or which is of a sticky nature or to place such mixtures upon any hard surface pavements of the city, unless in a platform or in a mixing box that will prevent the mixture from leaking or overflowing onto the pavement. All of which means, that after this ordinance is passed and goes into effect, the street with a hard surface pavement will not be the correct place to mix mortar or cement.

An ordinance permitting the use of what is known as the Eclipse fender on the street cars will also be introduced. On the outer edge of the Eclipse fender is a large rubber tube about four inches in diameter and this tube is supposed to act as a bumper in case of accident. The fender is so made that if a man is run into, he is thrown backward onto the fender and held there until the car is stopped. The new fender also enables the motorman to give his entire time in case of danger to shutting off the power and applying the brakes. The Eclipse fender is one of the latest safety appliances for street cars and its adoption by the Salem street car company has been urged as a matter of safety, the company favoring its adoption.

Americans Want Use of Railroad to Supply Army

The Twenty-fourth and Twenty-fifth infantry regiments of negroes left Columbus yesterday following Pershing's trail across the Chihuahuan wilderness. Other troops are still pouring into Columbus. Strict censorship still prevails there.

Despite the evidence that American troops need the Mexico Northwestern railway and the reports of uneasiness in the interior, it is said General Carranza refused the first Washington request for use of the road. A renewal of the request couched in even more urgent terms is believed likely, and in the event of refusal it is rumored the United States soldiers will forcibly seize the line.

El Paso is prepared for any emergency. Several hundred Spanish-American war veterans have tendered their services to the mayor. The militia has been ordered fully recruited. Fort Bliss camp is being enlarged to accommodate more men. All is quiet here and along the nearby border, however.

Do Ficht government troops are rebuilding the Mexican Northwestern bridges recently burned by Villistas.

Republicans Maintain Lead On Registration

The republicans of this state are holding their heavy lead on the registration books according to the report of Secretary of State Elliott who has received the reports from all of the counties of the state and compiled a record of total registration up to March 11 of this year. A total of 193,890 voters have registered and of this number 68,839 are republicans, 25,323 are democrats, 635 are progressives, 2,267 are prohibitionists, 2,776 are socialists and 3,147 are miscellaneous.

Multnomah county leads with a total registration of 30,558, of which 22,039 are republicans and 8,507 are democrats. Lane is second with a total of 27,513 republicans and 2,335 democrats. Marion county ranks third with a total registration of 7,984 or 4,423 republicans, 1,583 democrats, 25 progressives, 273 prohibitionists, 127 socialists and 241 miscellaneous.
