About the only changes in the market this morning are noted in eggs and produce. While a few houses are buying for 15 cents cash, the general run of buying is based on 18 cents cash and 18 cents in trade. Portland yesterday was paying 18 1/2 cents case count.

It is a long time that has no turn. After being quoted for the past year at 7 and 8 cents, roosters are looking up a little just at present and Portland houses are quoting a price that will enable local buyers to pay 9 cents. As to how long roosters will roost so high, from a market standpoint, is another question. In the retail trade, grocers seem to have settled to a price of \$7.25 for case and \$7.05 for best sugar.
