The local postoffice is continually receiving letters so carelessly addressed that no attempt at delivery can be made and they are held up here and posted in the lobby of the postoffice waiting perhaps that the writer may accidentally recognize the mis-directed letter.

Later, all these misfits are sent to the dead letter office at Washington and returned to the writer, provided of course there is anything in the letter to indicate the sender. If the writer just signs a letter "Dearie" or some such endearing term, the authorities are up against it as there are so many "Dearies" in the world who might answer to the description.
