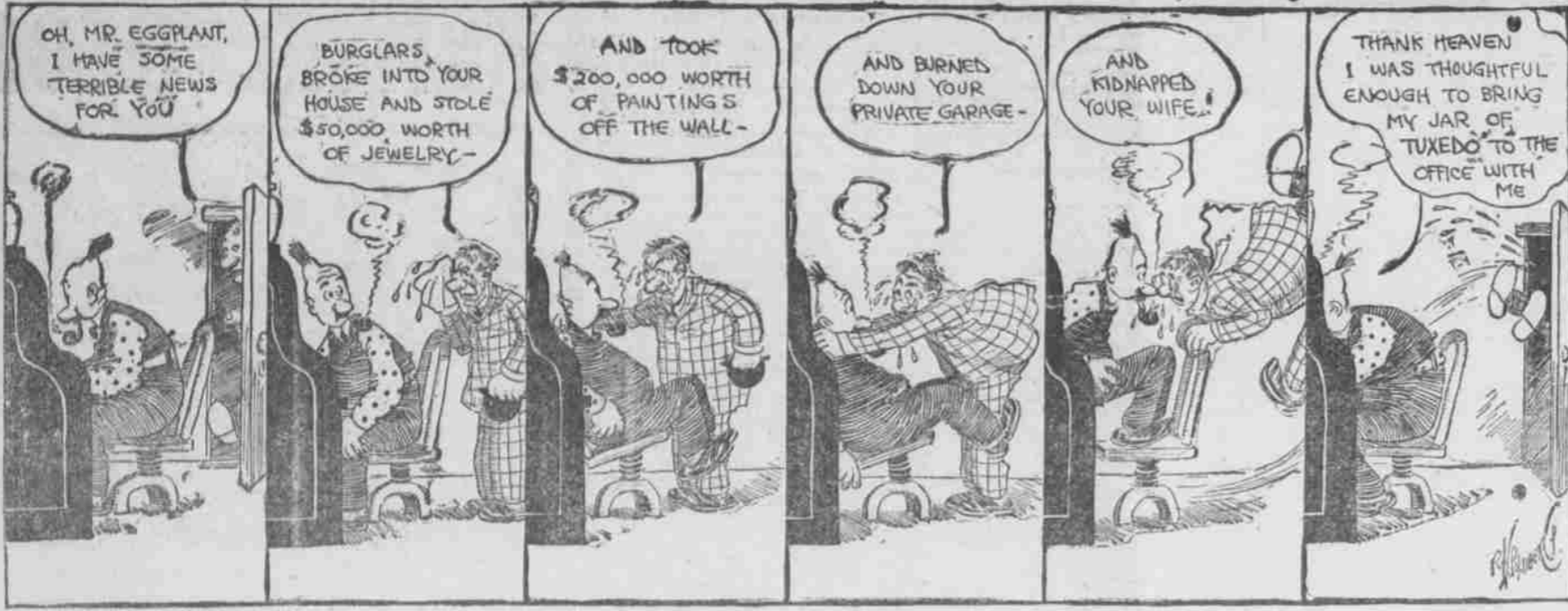

**EVER HAMMER HAILED AS COMING CHAMPION**

**Chicago Pug Handles Welsh As a Cub Bear Does a Roasting Ear**

Milwaukee, Wis., April 25.—A new luminary soared into the pugilistic firmament today. He is Ever Hammer, Chicago lightweight who leaped into fame last night when he defeated Lightweight Champion Freddie Welsh on points in a ten round bout here. Under the Wisconsin law no decisions are allowed, so Welsh cannot be deprived of his title, but newspaper critics were virtually unanimous in their belief that Hammer was the victor.

Hammer battered the champion with-out mercy from start to finish and Welsh was compelled to go the limit to defend himself against the Chicagoan's attack. In the seventh round Hammer floored Welsh with a terrific left smash to the jaw. Welsh says he broke a bone in his hand in the second round.

**Britton Claims Championship**  
New Orleans, La., April 25.—The world's welterweight championship was claimed today by Jack Britton following his defeat of Ted Lewis, the British scrapper in a 20 round bout. Referee Burks awarded the Chicago boxer the decision after Britton has out-fought Lewis from start to finish.

**Changing His Lines**  
Eugene, Or., April 25.—In an attempt to retrieve his double defeat last week at the hands of the University of Washington, Coach Bezek of Oregon today promises some drastic changes in his lineup if the team doesn't make a better showing. Washington will arrive Friday for two return games, after which the Oregon Aggies are scheduled to invade Eugene.

Portland, Or., April 25.—Chuck Ward, Portland's shortstop, will be the next man to draw his passport from the McCredie corporation. He doesn't sit consistently enough, Walter McCredie complains. McCredie is negotiating to get Bill Rodgers from Cincinnati for second base, in which case he will switch Captain Vaughn to short.

**No Special for Golfers**  
San Francisco, April 25.—There will be no special train to bring middle western golfers from Chicago to California for the western golf championship tournament at Del Monte in July. This announcement was made today when Jack Neville, secretary of California Golf association declared his association has withdrawn its offer of a train. The Western Golf association directors declined the special train because they feared use of it by golfers would deprive them of their amateur standing.
