Two Are Killed When Auto Tire Bursts

Los Angeles, Cal., May 4.—Two men are dead here today and a third is seriously injured as a result of an automobile accident caused by a bursting tire.

M. Strong and George F. Platt, both of Hollywood, are dead. Clinton H. Stagg, author of New York, is in the sisters hospital here suffering from concussion of the brain, broken arm and internal injuries.

The three men in a large touring car, were going at a fast clip on La Brea boulevard last night when a front tire burst. The car struck a telephone pole and overturned, pinning the three men beneath. Strong was killed outright, and Platt died within a few minutes.

Platt and Stagg were engaged with a local motion picture producing company, collaborating on a scenario for a big production.

ACTORS PERFECT IN PARTS IN SHERWOOD

Final Rehearsal Last Night—All Ready for Presentation Friday Night

The final rehearsal of the Junior play "Sherwood" last night proved beyond a doubt that it is the biggest thing in the theatrical line ever attempted by amateurs in Salem. From the time when the curtain went up in the first act to its descent on the last, the acting was in almost every instance the equal of professionals.

Prof. Wallace MacMurray who is in charge of the directing was well satisfied with the rehearsal, which is the final one.

There is no doubt but that when the foot lights go on for the first act Friday evening the house will be packed. Never before has anything of such magnitude been attempted. Seventy-five people will take part, and over 300 costumes be used. The scenery is new and was made especially to depict the forest scenes and the court in the times of King Richard the Lion Hearted. The second act lends a variety to the dramatic action, for in this scene King Oberon and Queen Titania assemble their court of fairies.

and the scene is made lively with fairy dances. Three special solo dances are also given at this time by Miss Esther Taylor, Miss Erna Borstad and Mr. Bert Ford, and these are classics.

The third act is a picture of the days when Robin Hood, the bold outlaw and his band of followers were at the height of their power. There are fights between the false King John's men and Robin Hood's men. Throughout the play the theme is the struggle between King John and Robin Hood for the love of the fair Lady Marian. King John has usurped the throne in the absence of his brother Richard Coeur de Lion, who is on a crusade to the Holy lands. During his absence, King John endeavors to crush the common people of whom Robin Hood is the leader, King Richard's sudden return in disguise saves Robin Hood and his men from defeat. He again leaves and this time while gone he succumbs to his injuries and John becomes king. Robin Hood and his men now are made to suffer and Robin is killed. Lady Marian however loves him with a love that knows no bounds and rather than marry the tyrant king dies with her lover Robin. Here in the last act the splendid dramatic acting of the play is displayed. Miss Violet Maclean stars in her interpretation of Lady Marian's love for Robin; while Miss Rosamund Gilbert in the role of Queen Eleanor shows great ability in getting the difficult part of the treacherous queen. Taban Steers, as "Shadow-of-a-Leaf" the court fool, has one of the most difficult roles but is master of the situation, for it is in the sacrifice of "Shadow-of-a-Leaf" that Robin

in Hood and Lady Marian are allowed to enter into the realm of the fairies. The play closes with a scene in the fairy court where all are happy except poor "Shadow-of-a-Leaf," who dares not enter into Fairyland because he has betrayed the fairies secret of how to enter their realm to Robin Hood. Earl Flegel, as Robin Hood shows exceptional talent, playing the bold outlaw's title in a natural manner.

Wallace Adams, as the false King John, portrays well the character of the villain. Karl Chaparr as the sheriff of Nottingham is an austere arm of the law and his sharp punishment of crime makes him a terror to the outlaws. Carl Reetz, who portrays the good King Richard is the man for the position, being robust and hearty.

Willis Bartlett, though taking a minor part shows up to advantage in his part Little John—Robin Hood's right hand man. Sam King, who is the monarch of the play also takes a minor part as a fearless peasant who would swear by Robin Hood.

Between acts there will be orchestra

music, and while the acts are in progress there are occasional peasant choruses singing off stage and Alan-Dale, Alfred A. Schramm, sings a fitting lyric in the second act on the return of King Richard.

Professor MacMurray deserves much credit for his successful preparation of this great drama and if what several of the best dramatic critics in Salem said after seeing the rehearsal last night is correct it will draw the biggest house of any play ever staged at The Grand.
