FIGHTING CONTINUES AROUND HILL 304

Germans Take Trenches and French Retake Them—Both Lose Heavily

Berlin, May 9.—Germans stormed and captured several trenches south of Hancourt in the region of Hill 304, it was officially announced today. All attempts on the part of the French to recapture the lost ground failed near Hill 304.

Germans also took several trenches by storm south of Hancourt and south of Termiten Ridge. Enemy attempts to reconquer lost positions on Hill 304 failed, it was declared. East of the Meuse enemy attacks in the region of Thimont were unsuccessful.

Want Garages Placed 20 Feet From Street

The city council which meets next Monday evening will be given something to think about when the Salem Floral society presents a petition asking that an ordinance be passed regulating garages that are located in the business part of the city. The society will ask that garages be constructed 20 feet from sidewalks in order that passengers may be protected from cars entering or leaving the buildings. British Treaty Followed

"While our differences with Great Britain cannot form a subject of discussion with Germany, it should be stated that in our dealings with the British government we are acting as we are unquestionably bound to act, in view of the explicit treaty agreements with that country. We have treaty obligations as to the manner in which matters in dispute between the two governments are to be handled. We offered to assume mutually similar obligations with Germany, but the offer was declined. When, however, the subject in dispute is a continuing menace to American lives, it is doubtful whether such obligations apply unless the menace is removed during the pendency of the proceedings."

NEARLY ALL TEACHERS WILL BE RETAINED

Directors Favor Physical Training for All Rather Than Sports for Few

Teachers in the public schools will have the privilege of waiting a day or two before they will know definitely whether their applications have been acted on favorably as the board of education, at its meeting last evening, decided to postpone the election of teachers until Thursday evening of this week, when definite action will be taken on all applications.

It is understood, however, that with but very few exceptions, all teachers will be re-elected, and that there will be but a few transfers to other buildings. The principals were all elected several weeks ago.

In order that there may be convenient definite rules to govern all the schools, covering the activities of all societies, the board considered the revising, compiling and the making of rules, and in this work they will be assisted by the school attorney, George H. Bingham.

At the request of the county court, permission was given to use the basements for polling places May 19 of the Richmond, New Park, Highland and Garfield schools.

The Washington Parent-Teachers association placed with Prof. E. S. Gannett \$40 to be used for the benefit of the school. On petition, the board granted Mr. Gannett the privilege of spending this money for a magic lantern, to be used in the school work.

Although contrary to the general custom and rules of the board, permission was given the high school students to sell tickets for the "Robin Hood" entertainment to be given May 31. As a general proposition, the board is strongly opposed to pupils going out and selling tickets of any kind, but an exception was made in this case, and it is probable that this is the last time this kind of a request will be granted.

Physical education for the boys and girls, and especially for those in the junior high school grades was fully discussed, with a decision to employ a teacher for the boys and one for the girls, each to devote their entire time to physical education. The intention is that the great body of pupils receive instruction and practice in physical work, and not a few who can qualify on a foot ball or baseball team. The policy of the board from now on will be to give every pupil in the school gymnastic work, and teachers will be employed who are experts in constructive physical work, rather than in coaching a few athletes. In fact, there is a strong feeling for a system of cadet military training. Director Leo claimed that very few boys or girls

could walk or run right, and Director Barnes, seconded by Chairman Miles hoped for a military training for the boys.

There is a feeling that expenses should be cut down where ever possible for the coming year but that the children should be given efficient physical training. The plan to be worked out is exercise for all, instead of a few.
