Teachers for the coming year for the Salem public schools were elected at the meeting of the board of education last evening, with but very few changes in the teaching force. Principals of high schools, and of the manual training department and commercial department are elected for 10 months. All other teachers will sign their contracts for nine months.

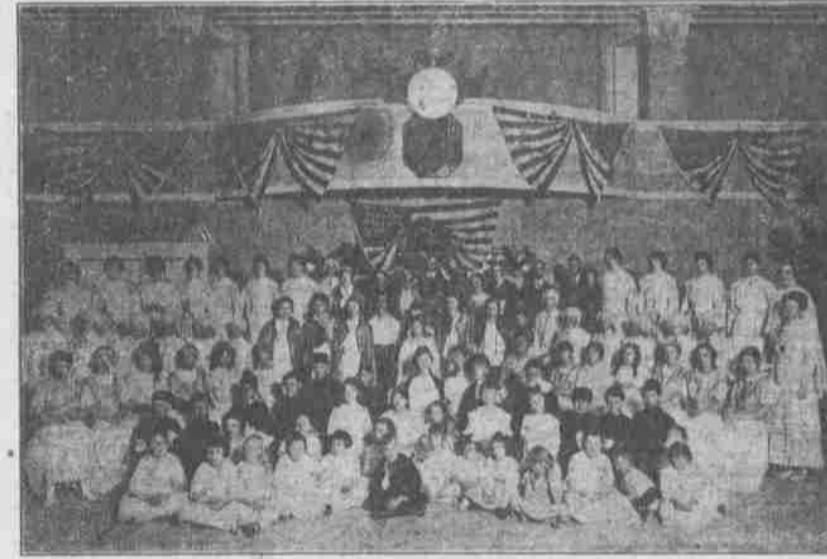

Phoenix, Ariz., May 12.—Mothers and wives, a few of them in tears, watched the first detachment of Arizona national Home Guard, for protection of in-

al guard leave for the border today. A 25-coach train, loaded with equipment left Phoenix for the border amid great cheering, carrying the first 300 troops to leave the state capital. With the departure of the first troops, plans were under way here to organize similar cities of Arizona. It was reported today that Governor Hunt renewed

his demands upon the war department for guns and ammunition with which to equip this force.
