One Thousand Delegates To I. O. O. F. Lodge Gather at Roseburg

Roseburg, Ore., May 23.—With the business streets of the city gaily decorated in the colors of the orders, Roseburg last night entertained more than 1,000 delegates to the grand lodge of Odd Fellows and Rebekah assembly.

The Patriarchs Militant opened the annual session of their department council yesterday, with Brigadier-General H. M. Beckwith, of Oswego, presiding. Their business session occupied most of the day.

Later in the evening a public reception for the visitors was held in the armory. The program included an address of welcome by Mayor Rice; remarks by R. A. C. Seely, president of the Roseburg Commercial club; address by W. H. Eaton, on behalf of the Odd Fellows' lodges of the city.

"Winter Injury" Causes Damage In Most Orchards About Salem

On Thursday, May 18, it was the good fortune of the writer to spend most of the day in the peach, pear and apple orchards in the vicinity of Salem.

The injury noted amounted upon practically all different kinds of fruit trees, the peach probably being least affected. Young trees from one to eight years of age suffered most.

The trouble is what is known as winter injury or scorching. It was caused in all probability by a warm day in February, when the thermometer registered about 60 degrees, followed by an evening temperature several degrees below freezing.

The severity of the injury can be told to quite an extent by the appearance of the cambium layer under the bark. If this layer is dark brown and the bark is loose from the tree or if the bark is brown and sticks so tight

to the tree that it shows there is no circulation of sap, then the injury is apt to show up severely in the tops. The limbs in that case either do not leaf out or, if leaves do start, they remain small or ultimately drop off.

Injuries were found running from very severe, with the trees practically dead, to those where the leaves on the tips of branches are small and backward and the cambium only slightly discolored.

Some of the trees severely injured will die, undoubtedly, but most of the others will pull through with the loss of a branch or two in some cases. If you will examine your trees you will find, on many of the trees apparently dead, that there are little pink buds coming out near where the others have died or where a branch has been cut off.

A word of caution should be given to those who contemplate pulling up or cutting down trees affected. Do not do this until you are sure your trees will not come back. Wait until the middle of June at least and then, if the bark is turning black or shriveling and no foliage has appeared you will be safe in removing the trees from the orchard.

It is nothing unusual for trees affected in this way to recover during summer, if good care is given them, and set a good crop the next year.
