Plans All in Talk Stage. By Perry Arnold. (United Press staff correspondent.) Chicago, June 7.—The hosts of republicans met in quadricentennial session today with about as much knowledge of who they would choose some time this week as a presidential nominee as Noah had about the probable duration of the deluge.

The talk part of this convention is getting on the nerves of the delegates. May be two days of depressing Chicago rain, fog, and wind aided. But the fact remained today that of the millions of words of conversation, conference and conflict, not a syllable has yet been transferred to concrete action.

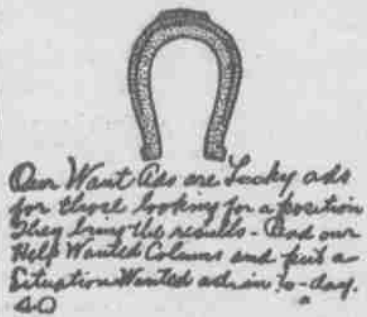
