peace to war strength and the state will be credited for the equipment it supplies.

Militiamen will be paid on the regular army basis from the time they report at the company rendezvous. Under the general orders from the adjutant general's office no man is to be sent to mobilization camp who will not agree to enter the voluntary army, except officers of the staff corps and departments. This is because of the likelihood of the national guard being called for service across the border.

Headquarters of the Second infantry are at Chico; of the Fifth at Oakland; of the Seventh at Los Angeles; brigade headquarters are at Los Angeles; the four troops of cavalry are stationed at Sacramento, Safford, Bakersfield and Los Angeles with headquarters at Sacramento, the three batteries of field artillery are at Oakland, Stockton and Los Angeles with headquarters in Oakland; signal corps company is stationed in San Francisco; field hospital at Los Angeles and ambulance company No. 1 at Napo.

The adjutant general and governors' offices were first advised of President Wilson's call for the California militia through the United Press.

They had not received the formal orders from Secretary Baker when they were apprised of the call by a United Press telegram at 4:50 p. m. Sunday.

Members of the Salem Poultry and Egg Circle met Saturday afternoon in the Commercial club, to the number of 25 and were addressed by E. K. Kirkwood of the sales department of the Oregon Co-operative egg circles, with headquarters at Portland. At a meeting held about a month ago, all the egg circles of this district declared in favor of establishing a Portland headquarters, with an agent to handle their shipments.

The demand in the city is for quality and eggs that not only have size but absolutely dependable as to freshness. Mr. Kirkwood said, and that in order to be assured of the better quality, dealers would at all times pay a premium on the regular market quotations. Dealers whose customers are among the high grade restaurants and department houses are beginning to recognize the efforts of the Egg Circles to keep only the best.

S. Benson Favors Spending Spare Cash On Hood River Roads

S. Benson, the roadbuilder, and member of the state highway commission, in a letter to Governor Withycombe today states that in his opinion the state has spent enough money in experimenting with hard surface pavement and that if there is any extra money to be spent it should be put upon the roads in Hood River county. The item that caused Mr. Benson to "take his pen in hand" was the proposal of the highway commission to appropriate \$5,000 to survey a commercial road-way in the city limits of Portland to connect with the Capital Highway and other hard surface roads built by Multnomah county to the city limits.

Mr. Benson says there are enough hard surface roads for connecting links and that the money should be used on the Columbia Highway.
