YAUQUI INDIANS WITH GREASERS AT ALLENDE

Eagle Pass Alarmed at News --Part of Fourteenth Sent to Nogales

Douglas, Ariz., June 22.—Responding to appeals of residents at Nogales, Ariz., a battalion of the Fourteenth infantry and a similar number of Arizona national guardsmen were en route to that city today. Military commanders were convinced of the truth of the reports that a large force of Mexicans was concentrating a few miles below Nogales, and feared another raid on the border. The Santa Cruz valley will be strongly patrolled and guarded.

Big Force Near Eagle Pass

Eagle Pass, Texas, June 22.—News of the battle at Carrizal created tense excitement here today, owing to the fact that between four and five thousand Mexican troops, including a large force of Yaqui Indians are encamped at Allen de, about 50 miles from the border. To cope with this force, General Greene has the Third and Thirtieth infantry regiments, a squadron of the Fourth, a battery of the Third field artillery, and four companies of coast artillery. These total 2,500 men.

PRUSSIAN MILITARISM

Prussian militarism is being rather than Germany. Minister Sazonoff was asked about commercial relations between Russia and the United States. "I see no real obstacle in the way of the closest commercial relations between Russia and America," he replied.

PIONEERS' OFFICERS NAMED IN PORTLAND YESTERDAY

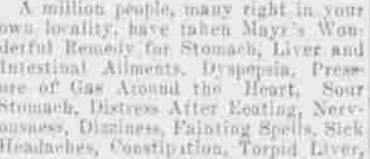
