Petrograd, June 12--(By mail)--Slowly, like a giant getting under way, Russia, backed by her plain people, is gathering strength. Today, working for her, she has an army of them fifty million strong. This is not sob-sister hysteria. It is truth. The Russian war is the people's war. With their incalculable fortitude the people are backing up the army in a way peculiar to them and not to be found in any other country of Europe. In England and France for instance, the governments are co-operating with industrial corporations and bankers--

Grazing Survey Completed On Wallowa National Forest

The completion of the grazing survey on the Wallowa National Forest is announced today by District Forester George H. Cecil, Portland, Oregon. This work has been going on for three field seasons. The entire Forest was covered at a cost of 4-5 of one cent per acre. This survey included the preparation of a map showing the topographic features, the location and extent of the different types of range, such as weed, grass, brush, and timber areas, as well as the location of all water and the best camp and salt distributing places. It also indicates the kind of stock for which each unit of range is best adapted. The object of the survey was to obtain data for the preparation of scientific grazing plans by which Forest Service experts say, the carrying capacity of the range will be greatly increased. In 1915, thirteen thousand more head of cattle and horses grazed on the National Forests of Oregon and Washington than during the 1914 grazing season, and according to Forest officers, it is necessary to develop the ranges to their fullest capacity to take care of this increasing demand for forage. The practical value of scientific range management is clearly shown by its operation on the Minam National Forest in eastern Oregon. A grazing survey was made of this Forest in 1912, and grazing plans, based on the information thus obtained, were put in operation. The Big Creek cattle and horse range on the Minam range carried 1200 head of stock in 1912 and was deteriorating annually. This season 2000 head, an increase of 66 2-3 per cent over 1912, have been authorized for this one range, and there is said to be grass to spare. A careful system of salting and distribution is in effect on the Big Creek range. It is believed by the experts in charge that when all the grazing land of the National Forests of Washington and Oregon is under scientific management, which grazing surveys make possible, its carrying capacity will be increased at least 25 per cent.

Orpet Case May Go To the Jury Thursday
Courtroom, Waukegan, Ill., July 10. The tragedy of Helms woods was detailed again today to the jurors trying Will Orpet for Marion Lambert's murder. Opening the closing arguments for the state, Assistant States Attorney Runyard declared evidence had shown beyond a reasonable doubt that Orpet murdered Marion. Three lawyers are to speak for each side. The case probably will go to the jury Thursday. Celeste Youker, the girl for whom Orpet spurned Marion, was said today to be preparing to sue State's Attorney Dady for return of her love letters to Orpet. These letters, seized by Dady after Orpet's arrest, were not used at the trial. Miss Youker, it was said today had made arrangements to return to the state normal school at Delaith. Ill., next fall to resume her teaching. She is an instructor in science there.
