FIVE-YEAR-OLD TELLS OF FATHER'S KILLING. Mother Says Husband Made Life a Hell and She Shot In Self Defense

New York, July 12.—Five year old Mary Beutinger, lived in her baby prattle today the story of how her mother shot down her papa yesterday.

"It was retribution. For 10 years he has made my life a hell," Mrs. Beutinger said. Mrs. Beutinger said she was subject to almost continuous mistreatment, citing occasions when she said her husband tried to gouge her eyes, beat her unmercifully and choked her.

All five shots which she fired at her husband took effect.
