TO Make Bathing Beach A Permanent Affair

Efforts are being made to make the bathing beach between the two bridges a permanent institution and for this reason, the grounds owned by the Salem Sand & Gravel company will be cleaned up by citizens interested.

Through the generosity of Joseph H. Albert, no charge will be made for the grounds. The bank slopes off gradually and a life line will be established making it entirely safe for those keeping within the lines. One patrol boat fitted with life preservers will be on hand at all times and another kept in readiness.

Electric lights will be strung in the park and plans are under way for a series of band concerts. For the children, sand piles will be prepared, diving platforms and other play apparatus. Arthur R. Wilson, who was in charge of the grounds last year, will again have supervision this year. There will be no loss of valuable space as was the case last year, as each bath house will be supplied with locker and a checking system.

The public bathing beach with all its facilities, is not exactly a municipal affair as the city council is in no way interested. It is through the Civic department of the Commercial club that the beach has been established and maintained and it is through this department of which P. B. Southwick is director, that the beach will be maintained.

INCREASED LUMBER RATES DISAPPROVED

Washington, July 16.—Increases ranging from 1 to 8 cents a hundred pounds on lumber from the Pacific Northwest to New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas were disapproved by the interstate commerce commission Saturday on the ground that they were not justified on the ground of uniformity.

The increased rates held unreasonable are those filed to become effective January 15, 1916, and suspended by the commission.

The increased rates proposed were the same as rates once in effect, but the commission holds that this fact alone does not justify the increase nor satisfy the requirements of the statutes.

The commission also cites the contention of shippers that were these increases to become operative California lumber and particularly California shingles would be able largely to absorb the New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas markets to the exclusion of lumber products from the northwest.

The order also provides the veterans be granted as many days additional leave, with pay, in each case, as long as necessary for the journey to Kansas City and return to their points of duty.

MASSING GREAT FORCES

(Continued from page one.)

The war office reported this afternoon. South of the Somme lively fighting is going on between German and French troops south of the village of Biaches, west of Peronne. The war office reported considerable artillerying on the whole Somme front.

More Russians in France Brest, France, July 17.—Another convoy of Russian troops landed here today.

Five convoys of Russian troops had previously landed at Marseilles and some of them have been in action on the French Champagne front. It is believed that more than 30,000 Russian troops are in France, these having been sent to the western front to emphasize the unity of the allies.

Russian Loss 262,000

Berlin, via wireless to Saville, L. L., July 17.—Russian losses in killed and wounded since the beginning of the present offensive until July 1 total more than 262,000, the semi-official news agency estimated today.

According to official reports issued at Petrograd since the beginning of the Russian offensive until July 1, the killed include 14,500 officers, among them 17 generals, and 29 regimental commanders, and 248,000 men, the news agency stated.

GERMANS WITHDRAW

Berlin July 17.—German troops opposing the Russian advance in Volhynia have withdrawn behind the River Lipa sixty miles northeast of Lemberg, it was officially admitted this afternoon.

The retirement was made in order to shorten the German line, the war office stated and was affected without hindrance from the enemy.

A Russian attack southwest of Lutsk fortress was checked.

French attacks in the Verdun sector east of the Meuse achieved no success. The French lost ground at a few points in the fighting in this region and suffered heavy losses.

17,000 More Prisoners

Petrograd, July 17.—About 17,000 prisoners were captured by the Russians in Sunday's fight in Volhynia. The prisoners captured to date include 134 officers and 12,457 men. The Russians captured 30 guns, a great number of machine guns, and other material.

Sank Two Daily

Berlin, via Wireless to Saville, L. L., July 17.—During the month of June, sixty one enemy merchantmen with a total tonnage of 100,000 were sunk by Austro-German submarines of mines, it was officially announced today.

American Farmer Ready For War Emergency

There will be no necessity for bread tickets or meat diet restrictions in the United States, in case of invasion by any foreign foe, because the American farmer is prepared for emergencies. This is the lesson drawn from an agricultural preparedness survey just completed by Hook Island Lines, as a voluntary contribution to the movement for industrial preparedness, inaugurated by the Naval Consulting Board.

Emergency increases of from 10 to 50 per cent in the supply of breadstuffs and pork are possible in most of the central Mississippi valley states, according to statements made by directors of a dozen state experiment stations, and published in the July issue of "The Southwest Trail," the Hook Island's official farm magazine.

Mr. L. M. Allen, passenger traffic manager, who had supervision of the work, states that the outstanding fact is the ability of the wheat, corn and cotton states not only to sustain themselves, but to furnish the bulk of the nation's food supply and to make quick changes in the farming program, should necessity arise, it appears, further, that the nation has available peculiarly efficient and convenient

Object to Making College Sectarian

Portland, Ore., July 17.—Nearly every Congregational church in the state was on record today in opposition to a plan to merge Pacific university with Forest Grove, Ore., and Albany college, at Albany, into one Presbyterian school.

Pacific university was founded in 1848 by the Congregationalists. Eight years ago it was made nonsectarian. The Congregationalists are willing that the 180 schools be merged into one nonsectarian college, but are opposed to any plan to make the consolidated school a sectarian one. Resolutions to this effect were adopted throughout Oregon yesterday.
