

GOVERNOR GRANTS SEVERAL PARDONS

Mose Lifer and Two Others Let Out of Prison, and Two From Jail

Governor Withycombe today issued a conditional pardon to Mose Lifer, who has been serving a sentence in the penitentiary for burglary.

Conditional pardons were also issued to two inmates of the Multnomah county jail.

Jack Mulcare, convicted of simple larceny and sentenced to serve nine months in the Multnomah county jail, was conditionally pardoned upon recommendation of Judge Robert G. Morrow.

Frank Webber and Claude Smith, who were convicted with Mulcare for the same offense, and sentenced to serve one to 10 years in the penitentiary, were paroled from the bench upon receiving sentence, upon their showing that they had work waiting for them outside the state.

A conditional pardon was issued to Bert Donnelly, who has been serving a one year sentence in the Multnomah county jail for simple assault.

Donnelly was sentenced in the Multnomah county jail in January, 1916, and his release at this time was recommended by Judge J. P. Kavanagh, before whom Donnelly was tried, and by Deputy District Attorney John A. Collier, who prosecuted the case.

State House News

Miss Florence Fox, who represents the United States bureau of education in the supervision of primary work and who is held to be one of the most successful primary instructors in the country, is to come to Oregon for instruction work this fall, according to an announcement from the office of State Superintendent Churchill.

The central committee of a political party cannot fill a vacancy on the ballot occurring through the failure of a candidate to accept a nomination. The central committee can only fill a vacancy occurring by reason of the death of a candidate or his removal from the state. So states Attorney General Brown.

Numbers for the proposed constitutional amendments and measures as they will appear on the ballot in November have been assigned by Secretary of State Olcott. The list is begun with the single item amendment, which is Nos. 300 and 301. The ship tax amendment is Nos. 302 and 303.

A statement of apportionment of funds for the year 1916 has been compiled in the office of the secretary of state. From it we take the following figures pertaining to Marion county.

Amount of taxable property as last equalized by the board of state tax commissioners December 16, 1915, \$41,149,295; sum resulting by levying a tax of one-twentieth of a mill upon the taxable property as last equalized, \$2,057,477; additional amount apportioned to each county by reason of the law providing that any one county shall not receive more than \$12,500, divided equally among the counties of the state, \$13,707; amount apportioned to the respective counties at the state for the year 1916 in support of any fair, land products show or livestock exhibitions for premiums upon exhibits of livestock, agricultural and horticultural products, etc., \$2,191,177.
