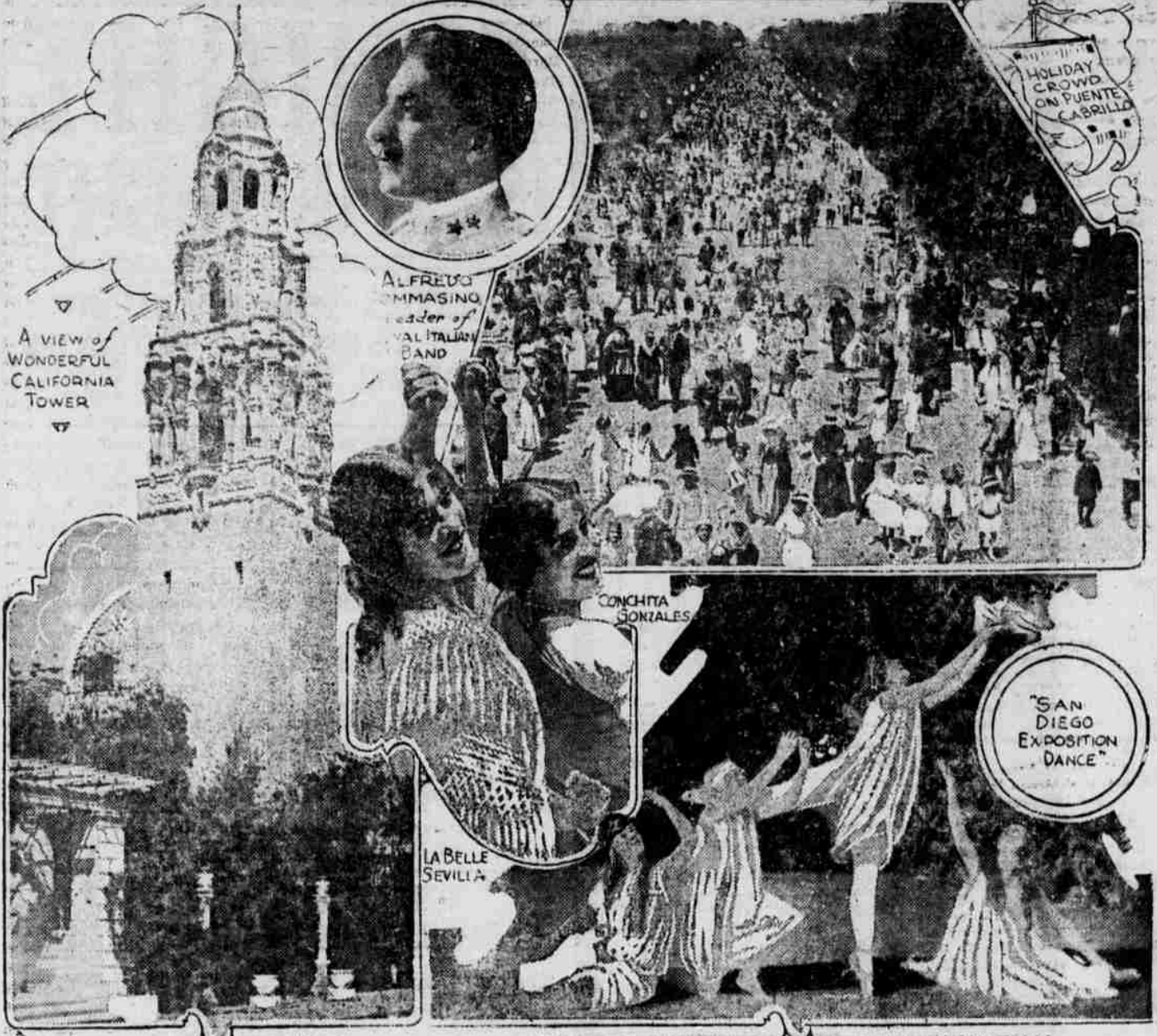


SUCCESS OF SECOND YEAR OF RECORD-BREA KING SAN DIEGO EXPOSITION NOW ASSURED



By GUY R. KINSLEY. The average age of great expositions has been less than five months. Financial, climatic and temperamental diseases have brought their careers to a close while they remained mere infants. There is one husky, beautiful exposition, however, which is hurdling all exposition laws and diseases, and at the age of twenty months is still defying and daring every danger to and its life before it has lived two full years.

Geographical location, world war, Mexican disturbances and political campaigns have not lessened the attendance of the second year, and in fact the record is greater than for the first. The two greatest days for the entire 1915-16 period have been during the present year with 44,825 and 45,259 persons. Each of these days is more than thirty per cent greater than the greatest day of 1915. The official report for the first 100 days of 1916 shows a total attendance of 648,707, which is 28,510

more than the same period in 1915. The exposition's success is assured and when it closes December 1, 1916, it will have a record of continuous operation that will stand for all time. It has been pronounced the most beautiful of all expositions—covering 614 acres in the center of San Diego and has exhibits from twenty nations. It is America's great vacation spot for 1916, and among the best events scheduled for the coming months are: The visit of President Wilson in September; Far Western Track and Field meet and Panama California International Exposition Boxing championship, August 17, 18 and 19; Dominion of Canada Day, July 24; Knights of Pythias Day, July 29; Holland Day, July 31; Los

Angeles colored church picnic, July 28; Kite Day, August 2, when 5,000 kites are to be given free to boys; Ruth St. Denis and Ted Shawn in classic dances, August 5. August 9-12, convention of American Association for Advancement of Science; August 12-13, Young Men's Institute Day; August 14-21, Fraternal Brotherhood convention; August 20-24, State convention, Ancient Order of Hibernians; August 21-24, Fire Chief's Association convention; September 7, Brazil Day; September 9, Admission Day celebration, and excursion of Native Sons and Daughters; September 20, Italian Day; September 24-30, Norwegian week; September 27, Alameda County Manufacturers' Day.
