A stipulation has been filed in the circuit court in the case of George H. Benn vs. Sarah Pendleton, N. E. Crowne and E. M. John Riessbeck, administrator of the estate of Thomas Riessbeck, deceased, has filed his final account in the county court, and the court has set September 23 at 10 o'clock in the morning as the time for hearing.

An objection to the findings of the county court in the matter of the estate of Dan Tracy, deceased, has been filed by the attorneys for the contestants. It is alleged that the statement that Tracy left no relative is erroneous, inasmuch as he is survived by a nephew, a son of James Tracy, brother of the deceased.
