Victor Murdock Has No Political Choice
Vancouver, B. C., Aug. 25.—Victor H. Murdock declared today that he could not honestly cast his vote for either Hughes or Wilson.

Mr. Murdock predicted the collapse of the war. "I have just returned from the trenches on the west front," he said. "Daily the German lines are growing shorter. There will be a collapse one of these days. It is my belief that Germany will give in, and that peace negotiations will be carried through without any—what shall I say—volcanic upheaval."
