Victims of Wreck Will Pass Here During Night

Marshallfield, Or., Sept. 15.—Refugees from the burned liner Congress were loaded aboard a special train this afternoon and started for Eugene, Oregon, where they will be transferred to Pullmans for the trip to Seattle via Portland.

The special, carrying officials of the P. C. S. S. Company arrived here at 12:30 p. m. Captain Cousins met the train and immediately went into consultation with Assistant Manager Bain of the company.

Sailors of the Congress remained behind. They are scheduled to follow in another special late this afternoon. Captain Cousins and the company officers did not start with the rescued passengers. It is understood they plan to board the blackened skeleton of the Congress when it is sufficiently cooled and ascertain the extent of the damage.

President's Sister Is Sinking Rapidly

Asbury Park, N. J., Sept. 15.—President Wilson received word shortly before noon today that his sister, Mrs. Annie E. Howe, who is gravely ill at New London, Conn., is sinking rapidly.

The news was brought to him just after he had finished a morning round of golf at Long Beach. He immediately cancelled other engagements and made tentative arrangements to go to New London later in the day.

ALLIES SCORE VICTOR

(Continued from page one.)

Greece's intervention in the war is still being delayed by diplomatic agents at Athens. Dispatches from the Greek capital today said that King Constantine has summoned a conference of all political leaders in a new effort to find a prime minister who will guide Greece into war and at the same time unite opposing factions in Greece.

British Gain on Somme

London, Sept. 15.—British troops resumed their great offensive this morning with a powerful blow against the German lines north of the Somme.

General Haig announced this afternoon that the British advanced 2,000 yards on the wide front from Bonlaux wood, northwest of Comblès, to a point north of the Albert-Bapaume road. The attack is continuing and many prisoners already have been taken.

Southeast of Thiepval, the British last night captured German trenches on a front of 1,000 yards, including the strong Wunderwerk position.

The British used a new type of heavy armored car for the first time in this morning's great smash and with remarkable success, General Haig reported. Four German aeroplanes were shot down in flames and four others damaged. On a single day on a single front since the beginning of the war have so many aeroplanes been put out of commission.

British air forces co-operated splendidly with the infantry in the attack, flying low and turning machine guns on German infantry.

British airmen attacked German headquarters at Bapaume and the enemy railway station, bombarding rolling stock and damaging one train. Two hostile kite balloons were destroyed.

Plew Across Bulgaria

Paris, Sept. 15.—A French war plane, one of four air raiders that bombarded the Bulgarian capital of Sofia, flew clear across Bulgaria from the allied lines in Greece, landing in Bucharest, capital of Rumania, it was officially announced today.

Serbian Chase Bulgars. Saloika, Sept. 15.—Bulgarian troops are falling back upon the Greek town of Florina, hotly pursued by the Serbians who have captured the principal heights of Malkandjic. The Serbians have captured 20 guns.

Sweden Holds Up Coffee

Berlin, Sept. 15.—(Via wireless to Seattle, U. S.)—Presumably in retaliation for the stoppage of coffee shipments to Sweden by the British government, Sweden has detained 10,000 tons of coffee destined for Finland, said a Stockholm dispatch today. There is a great scarcity of coffee in Finland.

French Take Trenches

Paris, Sept. 15.—French troops last night captured a series of German trenches south of Rancennes, by a spirited attack, advancing their lines to the edge of the village, two miles east by southeast of Comblès, it was officially announced this afternoon.

All German counter attacks both north and south of the Somme were repulsed.

All Attacks Repulsed

Berlin via wireless to Seattle, U. S., Sept. 15.—British troops made unsuccessful attempts to capture a German salient south of Thiepval by encircling attacks last night, it was officially announced this afternoon.

Murderer Jumps From Train, Is Recaptured

New York, Sept. 15.—Arthur Waltonson, self confessed accomplice in the murder of Mrs. Elizabeth Nichols, aged 55, who was killed and robbed of jewelry valued at \$10,000 about a year ago, hurled himself from the New York Central Flyer as it passed through Montrose, N. Y., early today, either in an attempt at suicide or to escape from detectives who were bringing him here from Ironwood, Mich. It was at Ironwood that Waltonson was arrested and made his confession.

Eluding his guards for a moment, Waltonson threw open the door of the car and deliberately leaped out. He was found to be severely injured when picked up by detectives who recaptured him after the train had been stopped.

A fourth man was brought into the Nichols murder case today when New York detectives arrested Harry Resnick, a restaurant proprietor of Dover, N. J., on a charge of receiving stolen goods and being an accessory after the fact. Two valuable stones, stolen from Mrs. Nichols were recovered the police announced and officers were sent to search in places in which Resnick said other jewels were hidden. Joseph A. Mulholland, one of the men now under arrest for the murder, sold a part of the jewelry stolen from the aged woman to Resnick for \$500, the police say.
