BLACKMAILERS GOT IOWA BUSINESSMAN

Trapped by Two Girls He Puts Up \$15,000 to Prevent Publicity

Chicago, Sept. 28.—The other side of the story of an Iowa businessman's alleged entanglement in a blackmail plot here and his supposed payment of \$15,000 hush money, will be told to Hinton G. Clabaugh, Federal Investigator here today.

C. E. Wheeler and W. N. Jay, attorneys for the Iowa man, told their client's story to Clabaugh here yesterday. They are keeping his name secret until after his daughter's wedding which is to be soon. The attorneys are of the firm of Brimm, Wheeler, Elliott and Jay of a city in Iowa.

Two girls in his home town, it is said, came to Chicago and in June, the Iowa man, visiting here, called on them. He had been in their apartments only a few minutes when the door bell rang. One of the girls answered it and in going out, closed the door leaving the man and girl alone in the room in which there was a bed, it is said.

When the girl returned from answering the door, she was accompanied by two men, one of whom said he was a lawyer.

The Iowa man says he was charged with violating the Mann act but was advised he could hush up the affair. He paid \$500, it is said.

Later the lawyer and the two girls visited the Iowa man's home town and there extorted \$4,500. They are supposed also to have taken two notes for \$5000 each. These are said to have been left with lawyers with the understanding they would not be negotiated if there was the slightest hint at publicity.

It is said there is no violation of the Mann act involved and it is not believed the case involves the supposed blackmailers recently arrested here.

Montana Man Shot by Girl Reporter

Missoula, Mont., Sept. 28.—Suffering from three bullet wounds inflicted by Miss Edith Colby, a newspaper reporter, A. C. Thomas, republican county chairman, was in a precarious condition here today.

The shooting occurred in the street at Thompson Falls. One of the bullets hit Thomas in the stomach. Miss Colby who was formerly in politics in Spokane, is detained by the police.

It is alleged that Miss Colby opened fire after Thomas refused to answer her questions and accused her of telling

Annual Football Contest Is Assured

Rumors that the annual Willamette alumni football fracas with the "varsity" would not be played this year were shattered yesterday morning when Coach Mathews definitely announced the return of the veteran warriors for their annual battling. Owing to conflicting dates in the "varsity" schedule and that the Salem business men may see the 1916 team under first fire, the game will begin at 10 o'clock sharp.

Although Manager Burgess F. Ford of the alumni team has been making strenuous efforts to sign up the stars of former years, the list of former patrons of the beef trust is still in the melting pot of doubt. Coach Mathews announced the alumni possibilities this morning which are an array that would instill terror into a cigar store Indian. The mere chance that either "Proney" Francis himself or Canamey Bishop of Salem Woolen Mills fame will play the charging role of fullback in good old fashioned style is sufficient to arouse the attention of football followers anywhere.

Braxler Small and Howard Jewett, the speedy Lilliputians of recent years and Lloyd Shisler will tend to the halves while Gingrich, Small or Kinney Miller direct the movements from the pivotal position of quarterback. For center Massey or John Carson are the eligibles with Harvey Tobie and Compton as nearby guards. Robin Day, Carson or Tobie are the best bet for tackles and "Doc" McIntyre himself may participate as one, if not both, ends.

As the alumni game is always synonymous for running in a string of substitutes about 25 men will probably figure more or less in the lineup. Coach Mathews announced his first team choices will be made from Peterson or Guerin, center; Proctor or Grapp, left guard; H. Tobie or Hassel, left tackle; Plogel or Dinnick, left end; Beach or Womer, right guard; Taylor or Spiess, right tackle; Rextford or Sparks, right end; Mooth or Grosvenor, quarter; Teall or Tasto, left half; Bynon or Tasto, right half; Taylor or Hatcliffe, fullback.

"With such a lineup of heavyweights on the alumni team the 'varsity' will do well to break even," said Coach Mathews. "Considering that we have had a first team squad for only four days, we haven't got much chance to win."

The alumni were defeated 27 to 0 last year by the varsity and determined to revenge the score, the game on Saturday morning will be a hard tussle.
