## OREGON SMOTHERED WILLAMETTE 97 TO 0

### Salem Bunch Never Had a Look In at Any Stage of the Game

Overwhelmed by an avalanche of sheer dynamic football power from the charging of one Hugo Bezdek's pigskin machine, the fighting Willamette bearcats were tramped on, muzzled and stuffed with the clay of Kincaid cemetery at Eugene Saturday afternoon to the tune of 97 to 0.

That the University of Oregon cohort was merely toying with the lighter but gritty Methodist warriors was apparent almost from the first blast of the whistle. And it was a continuous performance until the matinee was called in the early dusk. Coach Mathews' players offer no alibi; the team was just simply outplayed and outclassed.

The game as a whole was characterized by off tackle bucks and end runs on the part of the lemon yellowites from a new shift formation of five men on the line and six in the backfield as well as a well directed but futile series of passes on Willamette's part.

Although the game was a slaughter, numerous brilliant bits of work brought several players into the limelight. Shy and Hollis Huntington secured 6 and 3 respectively of the touchdowns for Oregon of the 14 made. For Willamette Flegel's passing and Grosvenor's booting for an average of 35 yards were noteworthy as also was the spectacular tackling of Dimick and Rexford who invariably downed the Oregon receivers in their tracks.

Willamette's only chance to score occurred in the third quarter when, after a series of five completed passes and Oregon's offside penalty, the ball was on the Oregon 20 yard line. It was passed over the goal line, but Oregon intercepted, thereby thwarting the cardinal and gold players' ambition to register.

### O. A. C. BEATS IDAHO

University of Idaho, Moscow, Idaho, Oct. 9.—Coach Pibal's speedy and well trained football aggregation scored a decisive victory against the University of Idaho on the local field Saturday and completely outclassed them in both offensive and defensive work. The score was 26 to 0.

Reardon, Newman and Anderson were especially bright spots in the Aggie's lineup. Reardon scored O. A. C.'s first touchdown by taking a punt from Captain Hays' toe on Idaho's 25 yard line and making a sensational run across the goal line. Anderson and Conn continually played over tackle and around the ends for long gains.

Moser, a freshman, was the lone bright light in Idaho's backfield. His tackles were hard and sure. He continually made long gains, but was always headed off from a touchdown by the Aggie's defense.

O. A. C. tried seven forward passes but failed in four and Idaho tried a single successful pass.

### MULTNOMAH WINS TWO

Portland, Or., Oct. 9.—"Dad" Convil's Multnomah Amateur Athletic club football squad made its 1916 debut before the Portland fans in a double header Saturday afternoon on the club field. The "Winged-M" did not show as much class as was expected by their followers, beating the Columbia university team in the first game 21 to 0, and nosing out a touchdown victory over the well conditioned and never-say-die aggregation of the Pacific university of Forest Grove, in the second clash.

The club squad was split "every which way" by Manger Convil, and some of the boys got a chance to show in both contests. Some of the newcomers played in brilliant style. In the game against Columbia, Chet Murphy was the big ground gainer, while Lynn Oliver, who was a member of the Lincoln high school team last year, gained most of the yardage made by the clubmen against Pacific by his long end runs.

### LITTLE TUFTS BEATS HARVARD

Cambridge, Mass., Oct. 9.—Tufts, with a team of veterans playing their first game of the season, defeated Harvard at the Stadium Saturday, 7 to 3, using a bewildering assortment of open play formations.

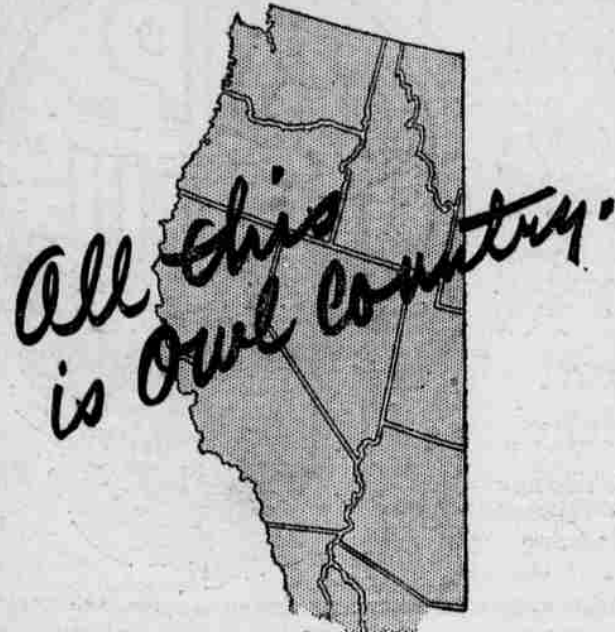
After the first half the Crimson was on the defensive most of the time trying to break up the spectacular game of the visitors.

### FOUR NEW WORLD'S RECORDS ARE MADE

Lexington, Ky., Oct. 9.—Four new world's records were made on the track of the Kentucky Trotting Horsebreeders' association here Saturday. A H. Osden's 2 year old filly, The Real Lady, driven by Tommy Murphy, in winning the \$3000 Breeders' sweepstakes, lowered the world's record for 2 year old trotters regardless of sex to 2:04 1/4.

Russell Boy won the 2:03 pace after four heats and in doing so established a world's record for a four heat race.

LT Axworthy, driven by Ben White, lowered his own world's record to 1:58 1/4.

During the morning Peter Look was given a record of 2:03, reducing the former record for 3 year old pacing colts 1 1/2 seconds.

### OLD ELI BREAKS OWN RECORD

New Haven, Conn., Oct. 9.—Yale atoned for last year's 10-10-0 defeat by the University of Virginia by overwhelming the Dixie collegians Saturday 61 to 2. It was the largest score made by the Yale eleven in 20 years.

The game had scarcely started before Virginia recovered the Yale fumble, and, being unable to gain, Carington lifted the ball over the bars from the 30 yard line for a field goal. After that Virginia never was dangerous, while Yale developed a powerful, crushing attack that swept the hard-fighting Virginians from their feet.

### Privates Who Qualify May Go To West Point

Sergeant French, in charge of the army recruiting station in this city, said this morning that the United States army is offering a course in West Point, the United States military academy, to the young fellows who join the army and qualify for entrance. He said that for the young men of today who wish a college education, nothing more ideal could be offered. Heretofore, the sergeant said, the course at West Point was open only to appointees by representatives and senators, but now it has been thrown open to young men of the army.

"This course," declared Sergeant French, "fits the young man not only for an officer but for almost any position in life. Upon graduation a commission as second lieutenant in the army is received. During the time at the academy the student is being paid by the government instead of paying for his education. And when he is through, there is a job ready for him." The sergeant expressed his appreciation of the interest being taken in the army by the young men of Salem.
