Council Will Discuss Budget This Evening At the meeting of the Salem council this evening at 7:30 o'clock the question of the city budget will come up for final disposal and discussion. The tax levy is expected to be fourteen mills and to keep within that limit numerous cuts had to be made in various departments of the city. The sum total of the reductions amounts to over ten thousand dollars. In the engineering department, there has been a cut of \$500; the public library received \$5,500; from \$5,500 to \$5,000; elections cut \$300; the maintenance of public buildings reduced \$500; printing reduced \$500; incidental expenses reduced \$500; the installation and maintenance of fire hydrants reduced \$100; nothing provided for the sanitary and plumbing inspector, and nothing for the redemption sinking fund loan; the amount for the deficiency of street fund levy of 1 1/2 mills is reduced from \$9,906 to \$7,350; the sum for material for the street department and labor has been cut by \$1,420. Other smaller items have been reduced so that the total sum of the budget for 1917 is approximately \$1,633,389.

Big Crowds Greet President Along Route (United Press Staff Correspondent.) Poughkeepsie, N. Y., Oct. 18.—On his first swing through New York state since the campaign opened, President Wilson was greeted at every point by crowds while on his way to Chicago this afternoon. At Harmon, a little railroad junction, apparently every shopman and his wife appeared in the yards and gave the president an enthusiastic reception. Word reached the train that a great demonstration is planned in Syracuse, when the president passes through there tonight. A parade of several thousand persons, carrying red fire and headed by bands will mark the passage of the train through the heart of the city. Vassar College girls contributed to the reception here. There were several thousand men and women at the station, and with a band to aid in the noise making, the president was given a rousing reception.

Salem Has 2813 Pails Attending Her Schools At the close of the school month ending October 13, 1916, according to the report of superintendent John W. Todd, 2813 pupils were registered in the city schools. The girls are somewhat in the majority as the boys number 1354 and girls 1459. This majority of 105 for the girls is due to the fact that between the ages of 14 and 20 there are 478 of the pupils are boys and 586 girls. It is in the primary grades, between the ages of six and nine that the boys are in the majority, as the report indicates that between these ages, 313 are boys and 290 girls. Between the ages of nine and 12 years, there are 335 boys and 348 girls, and the girls still hold the majority between the ages of 12 and 14 years, as the attendance shows 297 boys and 218 girls. Over the age of 20, all in the senior class are 21 boys and 16 girls. The average daily attendance for the first 15 days of the fall semester was 2385 and the per cent of attendance 95. Of the total number registered, 2813, the number neither absent nor tardy was 1557.

AFRAID OF INDIANS. Goldendale, Wash., Oct. 18.—A \$50,000 tract of land in the Klickitat country is being idle today because the tenderfoot who inherited it fear Indians. The property was bequeathed by John Heldman to several Ohio relatives. Attorney Brooks wrote them concerning it and mentioned that the acreage was on an Indian reservation. 'We'd rather stay here and keep our scalps,' said the easterners.
