British Ships Must Carry 50 Per Cent Grain

Galveston, Texas, Nov. 13.—The British admiralty has requisitioned all liners and tramp steamers in the Gulf and Atlantic trade flying the British flag, by ordering all steamers to carry fifty per cent grain cargo, according to advice received here today.

This new grain requirement, together with the metals requirements already in force, will practically load ships to their masts, making it impossible for them to carry cotton or a general cargo.

Heretofore, British ships have been required to carry one third grain. All British tonnage here has been withdrawn from the market and the order is understood to extend to vessels from all United States ports.

Portland, Or., Nov. 13.—Flour jumped 20 cents a barrel today, making the new rate \$8.10. This is another high record.
