ALL SHOW INCREASE O. A. C. Wants a Million, U. of O. \$796,000 and Month \$174,000 According to the estimate of improvements at the Oregon State Normal school at Monmouth for the coming biennium, President J. H. Ackerman states that it is planned to enlarge the main building so as to give space for an assembly room, locker room, and gymnasium at a cost of \$25,000...

The report of the board of regents of the University of Oregon through the secretary, L. H. Johnson, shows that the total expenditures of the university, including salaries, general maintenance, permanent improvement, and repairs, was \$796,950. The estimated receipts from the millage tax fund, the current expense fund, the University land fund interest, and the University Villard Endowment fund interest is \$787,400.
