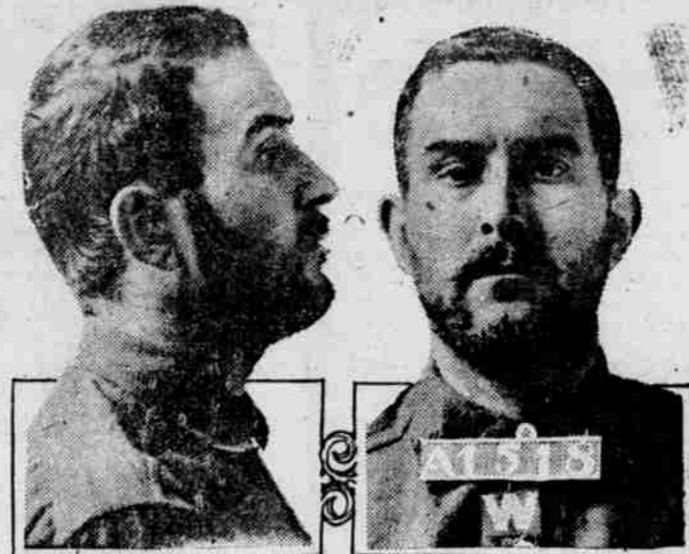

POLICE OF COUNTRY ARE LOOKING FOR LA TRASSE, KANSAS' MOST NOTED OUTLAW



William La Trasse.

William La Trasse has been conceded generally to be Kansas' most noted outlaw. About thirty-two years old, for fifteen years his name has been connected with the annals of Kansas crime. About November 15 last he escaped from the Kansas state penitentiary, since which time the police of the country have been searching for him. He is believed to have taken part in a spectacular daylight robbery in Chicago last month.

Guernsey, in the wheelhouse, is believed to have been crushed to death.

The four sailors who went down with Guernsey, were all below decks, trapped like rats. They are Engineer William A. Cator; Edward Stone, fireman; Eugene Dussant, deck hand, and Clarence Davison, cook.

Captain Hitch of the Eastern Forwarding company which owns the Deutschland was aboard the Seft, Jr., and was thrown into the water. Sailors from the Deutschland leaped overboard and dragged him on the submersible. He was nearly dead from shock and cold.

The tug Cassie's men helped in the rescue of other members of the Seft's crew and steamed back with the Deutschland.

Since the Deutschland came back here under her own steam, it is not believed she sustained any serious damage. Hasty examination led Eastern Forwarding company officials to believe she would be ready for sea again in a few days at most.

As the big boat put out rumors again were revived regarding a possible fighting submarine escort for her. The fact that the boat's departure appeared to have been suddenly decided upon led to belief that Captain Koenig had received word that the mooted submarine cruiser had appeared off the coast and was awaiting the merchantman.

Several thousand gallons of oil were put aboard early last night. It had been brought in a hurry from Palmer, Mass., by special train.

Eastern Forwarding company officials refused to treat seriously apprehensions of a man, dressed as a laborer, who attempted to board the Deutschland yesterday. The man carried a small package of black powder in bulk. Captain Koenig insisted the man be released, saying he was probably only a crank.

AN IRISH RAILWAY STRIKE

Dublin, Nov. 17.—Irish railway locomotive engineers and firemen, in conference at Thurles today determined to strike within three weeks unless given the same wage bonus as their fellow workers in England. The bonus is ten shillings weekly.

on the basis of official returns to the United Press from all but three of the 58 counties in the state, and estimates of Hughes' probable gain in the other three.

At noon today all counties except Alameda, Los Angeles and San Francisco had completed their official count. United Press tabulation of the returns of 55 counties gave Hughes a total of 212,397 and Wilson 229,334. This is a lead for Wilson of 16,937.

In the unofficial returns Hughes' plurality in Alameda county was 7,714 and in Los Angeles county 21,333, while Wilson carried San Francisco county by 16,094. This gives Hughes a lead in the three counties of 12,953. Deducting this from Wilson's lead in the other 55 counties, Wilson is shown to be leading by 3,984.

It was estimated today that Hughes' net gain in Alameda, San Francisco and Los Angeles counties will total about 230 when the official returns there are completed. This would leave Wilson's lead in the state 3,754.

Is Safe for Democrats. Albuquerque, N. M., Nov. 17.—Eleven of the 26 counties in New Mexico have officially canvassed the vote taken on November 7.

Of these counties eight are republican and three democratic, which causes the returns canvassed so far to show pluralities for all the republican candidates, though in some instances the pluralities are reduced from those shown on the unofficial returns. Of the remaining 15 counties yet to report officially nine are known to have given substantial democratic pluralities, three are known to have gone republican and in three the vote was close.

President Wilson's plurality in the state based on the known returns, will be between 2,000 and 3,000 it is estimated now.

Indications are that the official returns when completed will show safe pluralities for Jones, democrat, for senator; Walton, democrat, for congress; and DeBacon, democrat, for governor.

Hughes' Lead Increases. St. Paul, Minn., Nov. 17.—Official report of Hennepin county (Minnesota), figures today slightly increased Hughes' lead in Minnesota upon the face of United Press figures. Hughes' vote was 480,541; Wilson's 479,061. None of the three precincts missing yesterday have reported.

Stocks Generally Make for Increased Prices

New York, Nov. 17.—The New York Evening Sun financial review today said:

Vigorous buying from the western wire houses, covering by the short interests and pool activity combined in today's stock market to push materially higher the general level of industrial prices, under the leadership of steel and copper issues.

From the opening of the market the steel and copper groups took the lead and most of the issues advanced to new high record prices. Trading in the first hour was active in the extreme but there was a period of relative calm in the second hour, when a new wave of buying set in at midday that carried industrial prices to still higher levels. United States Steel advanced well above 125 and there was especial strength in Gulf States, Bethlehem preferred, Lackawanna and Republic. In the copper list Anaconda crossed 103, Kennecott sold above 61 and Inspiration and Chino went through 72.
